— the rapporteur proposed that am. 6 should be taken as an addition: Mr Goepel, author of the amendment on behalf of the PPE Group, agreed;

Before the vote on am. 57:

— Mr Fantuzzi said that, in his opinion, am. 50 would not fall if am. 57 was adopted as the two were compatible; he asked for am. 50 to be put to the vote before am. 57

— the rapporteur said he did not think the amendments were compatible;

— Mr Graefe zu Baringdorf, author of am. 50 on behalf of the V Group, agreed with Mr Fantuzzi.

— Mr Berend asked for the Spanish and French versions of ams. 5, 6 and 14 to be brought into line with the other language versions (the President replied that all the language versions would be checked).

— Mr De Vries, on behalf of the ELDR Group, asked for confirmation that the motions for resolutions on Kosovo and the Middle East, which were the subject of paras. 16 and 17 of the joint motion, would be put to the vote even if the two paras. were adopted (the President confirmed that they would).

- having regard to the Commission Communication entitled 'Agenda 2000' and, in particular, Chapter III of the first part thereof, concerning the common agricultural policy (COM(97)2000 — C4-0522/97),
 - having regard to the proposals for Council Regulations concerning the reform of the common agricultural policy (COM(98)0158),
 - having regard to its resolution of 4 December 1997 ⁽¹⁾ on the Commission Communication entitled 'Agenda 2000 — for a stronger and wider Union',
 - having regard to its resolution of 4 December 1997 ⁽²⁾ on the Commission Communication entitled 'Agenda 2000: the 2000-2006 financial framework for the Union and the future financing system',
 - having regard to the report of the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development and the opinions of the Committee on Budgets, the Committee on Regional Policy and the Committee on Fisheries (A4-0219/98),
- A. whereas the Agenda 2000 document constitutes the Commission's global strategy for the EU for the beginning of the new millennium,
- B. whereas that document devotes an entire chapter to the common agricultural policy and the means by which the agricultural sector can handle some of the future challenges, in particular the new international trade negotiations and EU enlargement, but does not put forward a general guideline for the future of European agriculture; whereas there is a substantial discrepancy between the principles and premises by which the Commission states it is governed and their concrete translation into legislative proposals,
- C. having regard to the Cork conference which defined the rural development strategy to be pursued in the European Union, based on a coherent policy for rural areas,
- D. whereas between 1990 and 1995 over one million farms, most of them smallholdings, disappeared, and whereas between 1990 and 1996 the sector lost over 1,4 million in assets (in MPU), while the farming population is continuing to age and part-time employment is on the rise,
- E. whereas, in the light of the new challenges facing humanity in the fields of employment, food, energy, the environment and water supplies, the EU should make new demands on its agriculture industry in terms both of its own development and of international cooperation,
- F. whereas the enlargement of the EU to include the countries of central and eastern Europe, apart from being a historical and political inevitability (which is necessary to maintain peace, security and prosperity in Europe), signifies not only the growth of the single market in agriculture, with new trade opportunities for both current and future members, but also considerable budgetary difficulties for the EU, adjustment difficulties, particularly in the form of administrative, environmental and consumer protection constraints, for farmers and administrations in the future Member States, and difficulties in maintaining income and employment levels for farmers in the 15 existing EU Member States,

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- G. whereas the reform of the CAP is both a necessity arising from internal factors and a means of preparing for the forthcoming enlargement to include the countries of central and eastern Europe and creating the prior conditions for future WTO negotiations, but whereas, on this last point, the EU must clearly define the negotiating strategy it intends to follow,
- H. whereas the margin for manoeuvre available to the Commission and the Council through the implementation of the agricultural budget (which in recent years has always been below the limits imposed by the guideline) must be able to be applied for the benefit of farmers and for the necessary economic restructuring measures in rural areas,
- I. whereas Parliament will in due course draw up its opinions on the specific sectoral proposals for Regulations in a consistent fashion,
- I. Calls on the Council and the Commission to take the following general principles and guidelines into account in the course of the negotiations on CAP reform in the context of Agenda 2000:

Consolidating the European agriculture model

1. The objective of the CAP must remain a common one: it must reflect an aspiration on the part of European agriculture to reconcile output, people and land, based on a differentiated approach varying from one production sector to another. The CAP requires a genuinely alternative concept involving a radical reassessment of a number of mechanisms. It must take account of the distinctive features of all sectors and of local differences, and must not carry within it the seeds of renationalization;
2. The main objective of the CAP reform in the context of Agenda 2000 is to consolidate the European agriculture model based on, on the one hand, achieving compatibility between the economic dimension of agriculture and its environmental and social roles, as well as its functions for regional planning, and, on the other, the preservation of basic regional products and the production of goods meeting high food safety standards;
3. Producers' associations and cooperatives can make a decisive contribution to preserving the European agricultural model, provided their role is strengthened and developed to allow them to play a more dynamic part in supply management, creating the conditions for linking market policy more closely to structural policy;
4. Such an objective presupposes that the CAP must aim to re-create a greater degree of consensus in public opinion on the basis of closer integration with the other Union policies for employment, ensuring a basic balance between products, farmers and territories within a framework of competitiveness and multi-functionality; the new CAP must work towards global performance and sustainable development. Within this general framework:
 - the concept of competitiveness must not be equated simply with the lowering of raw material costs which has for a long time characterized the quantitative development of an agriculture which to an ever-greater extent falls short of society's expectations, but should increasingly be equated with the supply of goods and services which satisfy society's changing demands by incorporating such aspects as wholesomeness and taste, local know-how which enhances regional characteristics, added value and diversity of supply — selling points which contribute to Europe's originality and give it an edge over its competitors;
 - the concept of multi-functionality must be clearly recognized in the agricultural sector;
 - the concept of food quality and safety must be regarded as an absolute basic value;
5. Parliament is aware of the need for the future agricultural policy to strike a new balance between shared management at Union level and decentralization at the level of the Member States and the regions, and that this can only be done by moving away from the existing 'managed' CAP model towards a 'contractual' model, with a rigid sectoral and vertical approach being replaced by a new horizontal flexibility; it considers that, in this context, a renewed contract between agriculture and society could lead to better targeting of public resources for the sector.
6. Such an objective also presupposes that public subsidies to farms should be dependable in the long term and that the justification for their existence should come from the people, in that they should meet the demands which society makes of agriculture. To that end, they must be less and less linked to production volume and farm size;

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7. The objectives set out in the conclusions of the Luxembourg European Council, aimed at guaranteeing the conditions for the practice of agriculture, must be taken into account in future preparation work; none of them appears in the Commission's proposal;

Prices and markets policy

8. The objectives to be achieved by European agriculture mean that there is still a need for a prices and markets policy based on the CAP's three traditional pillars: a single market, Community preference and financial solidarity, without prejudice to the adjustment thereof to the current realities of European agriculture and society, the EU's international commitments and the enlargement process;

9. Parliament therefore considers the price reductions proposed for the cereal, beef and veal and milk sectors to be excessive and rejects the abolition of the intervention schemes for olive oil and draws attention to the need for a fundamental revision of the common organization of the market in beef and veal in order to ensure market equilibrium in this sector in the long-term;

10. The prices and markets policy must continue to ensure that both internal and external market regularisation mechanisms exist, in view of the unpredictable behaviour of agricultural production and markets. However, the intervention mechanisms will have to be adapted in a more equitable fashion between the various products (although without jeopardizing the specific nature of each individual product or the possible reform thereof), so that they become more flexible and efficient;

11. Parliament therefore calls on the Commission to carry out a study of alternative or complementary methods (such as, for example, seasonal and marketing loans and insurance schemes), so as to ensure that products sell steadily on both the internal and the external markets, on harvest insurance and income insurance schemes, so as to prepare the CAP for the new WTO negotiations;

12. Parliament notes the persistently repeated imbalance in Agenda 2000 between the respective degrees of protection and support for northern and Mediterranean products, and calls on the Commission and Council to put an end to this situation via the forthcoming COM reforms and through the structural policies, in particular by taking up the conclusions of the 'jumbo' Agricultural Council of June 1993;

Compensation policy and income support

13. Parliament agrees that the CAP needs to be reformed but considers that the production and sale of agri-food products should continue to be the main source of farmers' income and the best guarantee of sustainable development in rural areas;

14. The direct income support policy must take into account compensation for whatever price reduction is decided upon and must ensure that agriculture serves to order and to protect the environment and the countryside in all rural areas of the EU. Additional environmental tasks which adversely affect income must, however, be taken into account independently and separately;

15. Parliament considers the Commission's package of horizontal measures to be insufficient, since they do not correspond to the need to reinforce support for family farms and put an end to the existing imbalances in aid distribution. In this connection, Parliament believes it is vital to introduce the principle of downward modulation of aids at Community level, using such criteria as holding size, environmental factors, regional planning and the use of hired and family labour, and calls for the savings thus obtained to be compulsorily used to achieve a drastic reduction in the existing imbalances;

16. The compensatory payments and income support policy must be structured in such a way that it assists the less-competitive holdings in order to eliminate their adjustment difficulties. However, it should not impose on farms in the EU which are already competitive any unacceptable restrictions on the path towards greater international competitiveness, which has been recognized as the way forward;

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17. In this context, Agenda 2000 must start from a broader vision of the compensation and income support policy for rural areas by proposing a coherent and dynamic scheme which embraces European forestry strategy, aquaculture, grassland policy and rural environmental policies;

18. Supplementary policies must be drawn up to compensate effectively for the structural and natural disparities of the mountainous and disadvantaged regions;

19. The subsidiarity principle, which already exists in the agricultural sector, should be applied more intensively so as to adjust public subsidy to the diversity of needs resulting from the variety of agricultural systems in Europe (which will continue to increase with future enlargements) and the varying ability of farms to survive and adapt in a more competitive international environment. This principle must be based on clear, precise, verifiable Community criteria and on an absolutely clear-cut division of responsibility between the Community and national or sub-national authorities, so as to avoid any trend towards the re-nationalization of the CAP;

20. Regrettably, the situation of young farmers is not mentioned in Agenda 2000, which means that proposals for the reform of the CAP deprive such people of any prospect for the future. The proposals relating to compensation payments under Agenda 2000 would result in economically and socially unacceptable losses in relation to young farmers' investment prospects;

21. The proposed compensatory aid for milk and dairy products must be considerably simplified and ensure that full compensation is given for the reduction in prices. It must also be guaranteed that this form of aid is compatible with the WTO trade provisions;

22. As regards the beef sector, the consequences for veal production are ignored and the important role which this sector plays in ensure the equilibrium on the beef market. Veal production should also be compensated for the anticipated loss of income, otherwise this production sector will become considerably smaller and beef production automatically considerably larger;

23. To prevent distortion of competition, grass silage aid ought to be introduced, along the lines of maize silage aid, in those areas where, on account of the growing and climatic conditions, it is not possible to produce maize silage;

24. The proposal for a single form of aid for all arable crops would make the production of oilseed crops uneconomic in most of the EU, and would fail to give even the slightest stimulus to efforts aimed at overcoming the EU's huge deficit in oilseeds and vegetable protein. An adjustment of the previous aid system can take place only gradually and must take account of the deficit situation in the EU;

25. The importance of aid linked to land and to the service role which farmers play *vis-à-vis* society should be considerably greater than that of aid relating to specific products. It should be possible to grant them in a manner appropriate to the location;

26. Parliament welcomes the fact that, in the proposals relating to certain aid schemes such as milk and beef and veal, the Member States are granted significant management autonomy by means of the national packages, which enables them to adhere more closely to their specific productive characteristics;

27. However, Parliament calls on the Commission and the Council to reconsider their decision to delegate entirely to the Member States (thereby encouraging excessive nationalization and creating the risk distorted competition) the environmental conditionality of income support, the variation thereof according to labour intensity and the limitation of payments as provided for in the horizontal Regulation, which lays down binding, harmonized rules at Community level;

28. The need to re-establish a better balance within the CAP and to restrict aid to a supplementary role which does not replace actual production will require criteria to be established which will restrict the overall amount of aid paid via the EAGGF to individual farmers;

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29. EAGGF aid must be used not to replace production but to supplement it and prevent distortions of competition. There must be no substantial risk to existing farming structures in the EU regions;

30. Specifically, the limitative criteria for the total amount of aid should take account of associative forms of agriculture, especially the existence of cooperatives;

31. Since there are no absolute criteria, the one which is regarded as being the most consistent with the CAP's land-use and employment role is the establishment of a limit per Manpower Unit/Year (MPU). The fact that MPUs are defined differently according to the type of farming system in operation could mean that this limit comes to have as many values as there are standard farming systems (based on the definitions of the FADN — Farm Accountancy Data Network);

Rural development policy

32. The purpose of the rural development policy is not to replace the CAP but to strengthen, supplement and balance it, combining price and income support measures with measures to support the diversification of the economic base of farms, structural modernization and the sustainability thereof. The goal of these measures must be the strengthening of regional economic flows which, through regional processing and marketing of agricultural products, bring greater added value into the region. Linking farms and their activities to their environment and the need to offer them the prospect of sustainable development mean that agri-environmental and agri-forestry measures must be fully exploited and incorporated into the rural development policy as a whole;

33. Parliament considers it essential, in the context of an agricultural policy aimed at promoting rural development, for infrastructural investment to be provided at a level ensuring the development of local markets and their marketing circuits and closer links between local producers and the corresponding local suppliers, and for the development of organic farming and promotion and information in respect of traditional and regional products to be supported;

34. The competitiveness of the entire agricultural sector should be pursued by means of support for rural communities, with a view to achieving integrated intersectoral growth. Encouraging the use of new technologies, stimulating growth in rural tourism and providing incentives for a host of small and medium-sized businesses will promote development based on agriculture which will tend towards a high degree of interdisciplinarity;

35. The essential feature of a new rural development strategy should no longer be support for isolated investment but, rather, the financing of integrated agriculture-based projects. In this context the rural policy should encourage the development of alternative and appropriate employment opportunities in rural areas, particularly those ceasing to be covered by Objective 1 or new Objective 2, as direct employment in agriculture declines;

36. Parliament calls upon the Commission to revise the Agenda 2000 proposals to incorporate the ten points of the Cork Declaration and thereby create a truly integrated, multi-sectoral rural policy which benefits the wider rural community and is not directed solely at the agricultural sector. In this context Parliament considers it necessary to address problems specific to rural areas such as remoteness and poor transport links, lack of employment opportunities and the need for diversification;

37. In this connection, Parliament is recommending to the Council that the CAP should be renamed the CARP — Common Agricultural and Rural Policy;

38. By virtue of its nature the rural development policy should be devised and implemented on a decentralized basis which incorporates the various levels of government and administration and also the bodies within civil society which represent social, economic, cultural and environmental interests;

39. Parliament considers that, in view of the scope which it will in future be allocated, the rural development policy should be significantly strengthened in terms of financial resources and it should be managed more efficiently;

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40. Parliament is also recommending that criteria should be incorporated to make it easier for young people to enter the agriculture sector and to gain access to the various types of quota, in view of the fact that the type of administrative structure which the CAP currently features does not serve their interests. Priority should be given to access to the profession for young people; the Commission should encourage the Member States to implement policies which give young people an incentive to enter the sector and to seek vocational training and guidance; the financial resources currently used to subsidize the establishment of young farmers under Objective 5a must be adequate and of such a kind that they can be extended to new eligible areas;

41. Parliament recommends more effective harmonization of the procedures for drawing up and approving rural development plans throughout the EU and the definition of the measures to assist rural areas which are provided for in the Structural Fund framework Regulation for Objective 1 and Objective 2 regions;

Food quality and safety

42. Despite the efforts which have already been made, quality policy, which concerns not only the safety of foodstuffs but also, in a wider sense, concern for the environment, biodiversity and animal welfare, must still be made the centrepiece of the entire CAP market policy;

43. Food safety should centre on three issues: health, agriculture and consumption. The concept of protection should be stressed at all stages of the food chain. Agricultural protection, in so far as it concerns food products, should be considered as part of food policy, which implies that the objectives of the CAP should be subordinate to those of the common food policy. It is therefore essential to preserve a European agricultural system based on biodiversity, quality and the diversity of regional products;

44. The notable effort made by the EU to improve food quality and safety must be continued more intensively on a joint basis and at Member State level in order to strengthen the link between European producers and consumers. In the international context steps must be taken to ensure that, with the growing free trade in agricultural products, European farmers do not suffer any adverse effects from the fact that environmental requirements are less strict elsewhere or are at least less strictly applied;

45. Greater funding must be made available for the application of existing measures relating to denomination of origin, protected geographic indication, labelling, plant-health protection and animal health;

46. In this connection, the conditions and mechanisms should be created for improving the certification of products marketed within the single European market, taking due account of product origins and socially and environmentally acceptable health conditions and production methods, without prejudice to the existing national certification systems;

47. Wishes to see a significant strengthening of measures to promote European agri-food products on world markets (measures which should be linked in particular to new quality policies);

Production for non-food purposes

48. The outlines of a global policy of developing products from renewable raw materials must be more clearly defined and geared towards the biofuels sector. Support measures must give genuine encouragement to job-creating non-food production. Account must be taken of the social and environmental aspects by increasing the use of renewable energy sources available locally;

49. The use of agricultural products for non-food purposes, e.g. for biomass, makes it possible to create new sources of income and jobs in rural regions. Ecological energy generation from biomass contributes to reducing CO₂ emissions. This sector should be supported in the context of Community legislation, in particular by means of tax privileges or exemptions, and, in addition, the use of certain non-food products with a positive life cycle analysis must be made compulsory, in particular in environmentally sensitive areas. Given its positive effects for agriculture and the countryside, biomass should be properly taken into

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account in the next stages of the CAP reform. Previous measures, such as those under the Altener programme or the growing of agricultural products for the non-food sector on areas supported under the set-aside provisions, are to be viewed positively. However, they do not go far enough. In the framework of the agriculture reform under Agenda 2000, support for renewable raw materials should therefore be increased;

The forthcoming enlargement

50. The situation in the countries of Central and Eastern Europe, which, from the agricultural point of view, have significant productive potential and considerably lower production costs than is the case in the rest of Europe, may in future create strong competition for farmers in the 15 existing EU Member States. However, this danger must not weaken the EU's commitment to remedying the significant degree of structural backwardness in terms of production, processing and marketing operations in those countries through recourse to the Structural Funds during the pre-accession and transition periods;

51. To minimize the difficulties of adjustment which will be experienced on both sides, the actual transition should be divided into two distinct periods: one in which the rural development policy (including structural modernization) would immediately be applied and legislative harmonization would be undertaken in the veterinary and plant-health fields, and a second one in which prices would be progressively harmonized and income support gradually introduced;

52. Starting in 1999, the EU should support agri-environment programmes in the first six acceding countries of central and eastern Europe so that the schemes are in place well before they join. Thereafter the other associated central and eastern European countries should be included;

Options and determining factors as regards the WTO

53. In a forthcoming WTO round the EU will have to engage in the negotiations from a position of vigorous, uncompromising defence for its agricultural system and its agrarian model, taking into account the fact that the planned enlargement to include the countries of Central and Eastern Europe will impose additional restrictions in terms of adaptation, adjustment and new internal trade and agricultural policy rules;

54. On that occasion the European Union will have to assert its own agricultural identity based not just on productive aspects but also on aspects relating to protection of the environment, territorial administration and the quality and typicality of foodstuffs. Furthermore, as a consequence of the opening up of markets, a process must be launched to ensure proper harmonization of the obligations to which farmers in the various areas of the market are subject;

55. Parliament calls on the WTO in its negotiations to resist the temptation to bring the CAP into line with the American model; in other words, the wish to consolidate the EU in its position as a great world exporting power might start the EU on a spiral of price dumping and thus of producer income dumping;

56. Without questioning the incorporation of agricultural products into the multilateral trade rules, it must be acknowledged that agriculture and the rural environment have specific social, environmental and other characteristics and constraints which are not shared by any other sector of the economy, which justifies the use of the principle of rural exception, which sets out the limits to globalization in the sector. Although such a principle is universally applicable, the specific nature of the European agriculture model makes the need for it particularly clear;

57. To ensure that free trade is socially tolerable, attention must be drawn to inequalities, and new common international rules be drawn up, incorporating clauses in such important areas as production costs, socio-employment and environmental law, the need for food safety and awareness of consumer sensitivity. The Commission, during the next round of negotiations, must therefore make use of the room for manoeuvre gained through the dismantling of export refunds to guarantee an appropriate and effective external protection against social and environmental dumping;

58. The Council and Commission must also defend these principles of fair trade and coherence with the other Union policies when negotiating free trade agreements with third countries or other common market organizations;

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Budget issues

59. Parliament considers that the current criteria for determining the guideline, which from the start constituted a reference and stability framework for economic operators in the agri-food sector, should be maintained;

60. The guideline should be used to finance all rural development measures intended for farmers (whether or not they are situated within Objective 1 regions), including structural, agri-environmental and agri-forestry measures and also compensatory payments to disadvantaged regions, which will help to improve the internal cohesion of agricultural and rural policy and pre-accession policy;

61. For reasons of clarity and budget transparency the funding of all pre-accession measures for the countries of Central and Eastern Europe (agriculture-related or otherwise) should be entered under its own heading, outside the guideline, and the measures should subsequently be incorporated into the funding of the respective policies as enlargement to include each of the countries concerned proceeded;

62. The strengthening of the various measures which is proposed in this resolution should be financed from the savings made by means of a smaller reduction in prices, efficient use of the funds available under the guideline and appropriate checks on the allocation of funding;

Regional policy

63. Parliament notes the Commission's proposals for a Regulation for the promotion of rural development through the EAGGF and for a Regulation on structural measures in the fisheries sector as giving concrete form to Agenda 2000; the new EAGGF Regulation recently proposed brings together nine existing Regulations (including four Objective 5a Regulations and the three Regulations on agricultural flanking measures), although details of its funding are not yet available;

64. Parliament fully supports the conclusion of the Luxembourg summit to the effect that the conditions for agricultural production must be protected everywhere in Europe, including areas with specific problems;

65. The proposal for a new EAGGF Regulation brings together for the first time all the measures for the development of rural areas and thus contributes to simplification and transparency; however, a structure with nine different types of measures, two separate sources of funding (the EAGGF Guarantee and Guidance sections, with two separate budget headings) and two different planning approaches (Objectives 1 and 2 and others) still represents a degree of complexity which fails to reflect the principle of a simple, targeted and coherent policy for rural areas;

66. The proposed new EAGGF Regulation regrettably does not really make sustainable rural development, as proposed in the Cork Declaration, into one of the European Union's main concerns; its grouping of existing instruments under a single heading does not reveal any new perspectives such as to justify the title of 'second pillar of agricultural policy';

67. Parliament is concerned that the rural areas in the new Objective 2 will suffer in relation to the industrial areas, and therefore calls for special measures to preserve the viability of rural areas and to resolve the problem of flight from the land;

68. Public subsidies should be granted not solely in the regions eligible for aid under the EU's structural policy, but also in regions which are not eligible for aid, particularly rural and island areas whose regional economies are threatened;

69. The Commission should put forward firm proposals to link agriculture with its local region (action on quality, local products, labelling) and thus allow the harmonious development of rural areas involving the two main economic activities of agriculture and craft industries (SMEs upstream and downstream of agriculture), while ensuring that all local services are maintained;

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70. The Commission's initial proposals for a Regulation on the future EAGGF Guarantee section do not incorporate the zones which are not eligible under the proposed Objective 1 and 2 for fisheries and aquaculture; under the adjustments made to Agenda 2000 by the Commission on 18 March 1998 these zones are now to be supported from the EAGGF Guarantee section; in this connection, the Commission is asked to submit as soon as possible details of the arrangements and conditions for the Community's financial participation, to permit a genuine assessment to be made of the proposed structural policy on fisheries;

71. Parliament is concerned at the possible drastic reduction in the budget allocated to structural actions for agriculture, fisheries and aquaculture at a time when the structural changes to these sectors have not been completed and the implementation of the CFP requires significant financial resources and when it is also necessary to assist young farmers and young fishermen to invest and set up, their financial needs being particularly significant in the less-favoured and island regions;

72. The Commission is reminded of the conclusion of the Luxembourg summit in December 1997 to the effect that it should be possible to preserve a viable rural environment by farming throughout the European territory, including less favoured, mountainous and remote areas; the Commission is urged to act in accordance with these demands;

73. The Commission is urged to support by all possible means activities supplementary to farming (such as rural tourism and direct sales of produce by farms) with a view to diversifying production in rural areas;

74. Parliament reiterates its call for the creation of a specific horizontal Regulation for fisheries and the saltwater and inland aquaculture sector, in order to preserve the future of the FIFG and to have the necessary funding to implement the CFP and also to ensure real support for rural development and for small and medium-sized farms which complements the changes in the CAP, including in the less-favoured and island regions;

75. Parliament notes with interest the changes of emphasis and proposals introduced by the Commission in its Agenda 2000 proposal on 18 March 1998 but considers nevertheless that these efforts are inadequate;

76. Parliament reiterates its call for horizontal support for rural areas;

Fisheries policy

77. It is regrettable that, contrary to the situation which existed under Objective 5a which applied to all the territory of the Member States of the Union not covered by Objectives 1 and 6, the zones eligible under Objective 2 would be considerably reduced, as they would be restricted to those coastal areas where employment in the fisheries sector reaches a significant level;

78. It is regrettable that the mainland aquaculture enterprises or the processing enterprises based outside coastal areas could be excluded from the new provision;

79. It is regrettable that the rate of intervention through official aid could range from 75% for Objective 1 regions to 0% for regions which are not eligible at all, even when vessels fishing in the same zones are affected;

80. Parliament notes and condemns the fact that the initial proposals for a Commission Regulation on the future EAGGF Guarantee section do not incorporate the zones which are not eligible under Objective 1 and 2 for fisheries and aquaculture;

81. Parliament wonders about the future of the FIFG, which at present covers almost all structural interventions for fisheries and aquaculture;

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II. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council and Commission.

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Commission communication (COM(97)2000 — C4-0523/97),
 - having regard to the EC Treaty, and in particular Article 130a thereof on economic and social cohesion, Article 2 thereof on the tasks of the Community and Article 130d thereof on the coordination of the Structural Funds,
 - having regard to the Commission's annual reports on the Cohesion Fund and the Structural Funds and its resolutions thereon,
 - having regard to the Commission's White Paper on growth, competitiveness and employment (the Delors report), and in particular Chapter 10 thereof on sustainable development,
 - having regard to its resolution of 5 September 1996 on the Commission communication on a European strategy for encouraging local development and employment initiatives ⁽¹⁾,
 - having regard to the results of the European Council on employment in Luxembourg in November 1997,
 - having regard to the first triennial report on economic and social cohesion (COM(96)0542), and its resolution thereon of 19 November 1997 ⁽²⁾,
 - having regard to its resolution of 21 November 1997 on the future of the European Social Fund ⁽³⁾,
 - having regard to its resolutions of 4 December 1997 on the communication from the Commission 'Agenda 2000 — for a stronger and wider Union' (COM(97)2000 — C4-0371/97) ⁽⁴⁾ concerning a strategy for enlargement and its impact on EU policies and on the communication from the Commission on Agenda 2000: the 2000-2006 financial framework for the Union and the future financing system (COM(97)2000 — C4-0372/97) ⁽⁵⁾; having regard to the opinions of the Committee on Regional Policy on the reports on which these resolutions are based,
 - having regard to the report of the Committee on Regional Policy and the opinions of the Committee on Budgets, the Committee on Employment and Social Affairs and the Committee on Fisheries (A4-0210/98),
- A. aware that the Structural and Cohesion Funds are the central instruments of economic and social cohesion in the European Union and that they serve the common objective of promoting the harmonious development of the Community as a whole by reducing the disparities in the levels of development of the various regions and the underdevelopment of the most disadvantaged regions, including rural areas, and making a key contribution to the fight against unemployment and social exclusion,
- B. whereas the Treaty attaches paramount importance to structural policy, which is intended to improve the economic strength of the most disadvantaged regions, as determined by their level of GDP,
- C. whereas in the internal market growth in economic activities may be concentrated on the centres of gravity, to the detriment of disadvantaged regions and the natural environment; whereas, however, even in those centres whole sectors of society do not share in the advantages but are increasingly being forced into poverty; whereas, accordingly, the advantages of integration do not benefit all regions and all people in Europe equally,

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- D. whereas the idea of a 'Citizens Europe' applies independently of regional location or social standing and whereas it is the shared political task of all Member States to grant everyone comparable opportunities while at the same time avoiding the risk of generations to come being unable to satisfy their needs,
 - E. having regard to the great challenge facing economic and social cohesion if the EU is enlarged to include a number of central and eastern European states and Cyprus, since these are countries with regions which are lagging way behind the Fifteen in terms of development, together with the efforts which the Member States have to make in the third stage of monetary union,
 - F. aware of the need for a revision of the current Structural Funds, partly in view of the expiry of the Edinburgh agreements and partly in order to reduce regional and national imbalances, enhance the Funds' effectiveness in fostering sustainable development, enable jobs to be created and keep administrative expenditure at a reasonable level,
 - G. aware that the Commission has proposed a reduction in the Structural Fund Objectives from six (or rather seven, with the split of 5a and 5b) to three, and whereas it envisages with this greater concentration a reduction in the percentage of people eligible for aid; whereas it would be regrettable, however, in view of the progress made in agricultural reform, for there be no separate support objective for rural areas,
 - H. whereas, according to the Commission proposals, Objective 1 is to continue to cover underdeveloped regions with a per capita GDP, expressed as purchasing power parities, less than 75% of the Community average, but also all current Objective 6 regions and the ultraperipheral areas,
 - I. whereas the new Objective 2 is rather complex, since it includes not only areas undergoing economic change but also rural areas in recession and areas dependent on fisheries together with urban areas with severe social problems, and whereas, according to the Commission proposals, Member States will have the flexibility to determine, on the basis of national and local criteria, a percentage of Objective 2 areas within their population thresholds,
 - J. whereas the Commission proposes to make Objective 3 a horizontal support instrument to be used, in accordance with the long-term employment plans and the new employment chapter in the Treaty of Amsterdam, in the fight against unemployment; whereas, in its resolution of 21 November 1997 referred to above, it set the priority as lifelong learning and expressed the wish for a continuation of the preventive adjustment of human resources to economic change and a modernization of training and employment systems,
 - K. concerned that, in the absence of support programmes for SMEs, Objective 3 will lose an important instrument for creating sustainable jobs,
 - L. noting that the Commission is proposing the retention of the Cohesion Fund in its current form, and advocating the retention of a cohesion fund,
 - M. concerned as to whether the Commission's optimistic forecast of economic growth rates in the EU represents a sound basis for a credible enlargement process in which the CEECs will have to adapt speedily to Community policies, in particular to avoid ecological and social dumping,
 - N. whereas assistance for structural measures in the applicant countries should be designed in such a way as to speed up the development of the economies of these countries as far as possible; expressing the hope that future structural measures in the CEECs will support local and regional development in addition to the SME sector and employment measures,
- 1. Takes the view that the European Union's philosophy of integration is credible only if it continues to make economic and social cohesion a political priority;
 - 2. Welcomes in principle the Commission's plans to reform the Structural Funds on the lines of concentration, simplification and efficiency; stresses once again, however, the democratic nature of the Structural Funds which is expressed in the dual principle of participation: by the Member States, on the one hand, and by local and regional authorities and the social partners, on the other;

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3. Calls on the Commission to incorporate in the new Structural Funds the objectives of the Treaty — sustainable development, a high level of employment achieved by paying particular attention to SMEs, innovation and the exploitation of new technologies, an appropriate level of social protection, the combating of social exclusion, a better quality of life, an improved environment and equality for men and women — to ensure a European added value when responsibilities are shifted, as planned, to the Member States in order to support the essential objective of the policy of economic and social cohesion laid down in Article 130a of the Treaty;
4. Considers it of fundamental importance to continue giving priority to strengthening Objective 1 regions on the basis of the criterion of a per capita GDP lower than 75% of the Community average and believes that roughly two-thirds of all Structural Fund resources should be allocated to these regions;
5. Welcomes the Commission's proposal to allow all regions of the Union which will no longer be eligible for Objectives 1, 2 and 5b a period of phasing-out tailored to their requirements, and expects that under the new partnership arrangements a new standard of decision-making and results can be achieved;
6. Welcomes the ideas of providing guarantee funding for rural development as part of the agricultural reform; underlines the need for Parliament's full involvement in the scrutiny, evaluation and financial monitoring of rural regional programmes and fully expects the programmes to comply with the principle of partnership and programming applicable to other regional development programmes;
7. Proposes the splitting of Objective 2 into two sub-categories — industrial/urban and rural and fisheries — with their own specific eligibility criteria, objectives and financial quotas to ensure specific and guaranteed support for rural areas, without jeopardizing the need to strike a balance between town and country, on the one hand, and the democratic quality of structural policy, on the other; regards the new definition of Objective 2 proposed by the Commission as unsatisfactory and draws attention to the risk of imbalances in financing between industrial and rural areas;
8. Calls on the Commission to focus Objective 3 on support for local development and employment initiatives, too, and at the same time to support the job-creation side of this policy with accompanying activities;
9. Expects from the Commission that, precisely because the Community initiatives have been reduced, it will pay attention to ensuring that resources are allocated in particular to projects with a European added value, always in the context of the need to strengthen economic and social cohesion, and that, in terms of cooperation with third countries, it will examine whether the financing procedures can be facilitated through the creation of joint funds;
10. Takes the view that, because of their geographical location, special aid, in particular under the Interreg Community initiative, is essential to cope with the particular problems faced by regions bordering on applicant countries;
11. Believes that the future development of a successful structural policy aimed at improving the instruments for economic and social cohesion on the basis of sustainable regional development depends on an increase in the structural funding available for innovative measures under a future model fund, with management rules revised accordingly;
12. Shares the Commission's objective of enhancing the effectiveness and profitability of the Structural Funds, while expressing doubt as to the viability of the 10% reserve system;
13. Hopes that the EIB and EIF loans will be used as additional means besides Structural Fund subsidies;
14. Hopes that the Commission is not intending to make 'savings' which undermine the principle of economic and social cohesion by penalizing the failure to take up appropriations through a decision not to reincorporate those appropriations into the budget in the context of multiannual programming;
15. Proposes that the Structural Fund Regulations, which will probably not be finally adopted before the end of 1998, should be preceded by arrangements which chiefly ensure the prompt participation of the regional and local partners and the social partners and guarantee their involvement in establishing the programmes, with a view to eradicating the delays of previous programming phases;

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16. Calls on the Council to adopt the Regulations on the Structural Funds as soon as possible to ensure that the new programming period can begin on time;
17. Calls on the Commission to provide indicators to safeguard cost-revenue control and compliance with common political principles in drawing up and implementing the programmes;
18. Stresses the importance of monitoring committees not only for balanced monitoring, but also for revision and adaptation, and expects the composition of the monitoring committees to reflect the new requirements of EU regional policy and to safeguard their authority and decision-making powers; is of the opinion that the participation of the social partners should be organized in such a way as to ensure that it is representative;
19. Supports the continuation of a Cohesion Fund beyond the year 2000, without prejudice to its final position, to be expressed in the framework of the legislative procedure concerning the Cohesion Fund Regulation; notes that the Commission proposes maintaining a Cohesion Fund for Member States whose GDP per capita is less than 90% of the Community average;
20. Considers it appropriate that, where the pre-accession strategy and the transitional period following accession are concerned, provision should be made for a specific and horizontal financial instrument under the Structural Funds designed to ensure gradual and optimum integration, with funding appropriate to the absorption capacity of the countries concerned;
21. Calls on the Commission, in respect of the fisheries sector, to recognize the particular needs of fisheries areas in the context of promoting economic and social cohesion;
22. Stresses the importance of ensuring that the European Union operates in a transparent manner; considers it essential, therefore, to involve the social partners more closely in European Social Fund action and insists that those concerned be given more information, so as to facilitate access to the various European programmes;
23. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission and the governments and parliaments of the Member States.

3. Cardiff European Council

B4-0685, 0686, 0687, 0688, 0689, 0690 and 0691/98

Resolution on the outcome of the meeting of the European Council in Cardiff on 15-16 June 1998

The European Parliament,

— having regard to the conclusions of the meeting of the European Council in Cardiff on 15-16 June 1998,

1. Notes the decision of the Heads of State or Government to embark on institutional reform in the broad sense in order to pave the way for rapid enlargement in keeping with the wishes expressed by Parliament;
2. Reiterates that it is willing to help prepare the reforms, for which a detailed timetable must be drawn up;
3. Reaffirms its commitment to bring Europe closer to citizens; points to the consequent need for greater integration in the spheres of the CFSP, home affairs and justice;
4. Takes note of the holding of an informal summit during the Austrian Presidency in October 1998 to review ways of making the EU more vital and more accessible to people, more efficient and better prepared for enlargement; in this context, asks the European Council to focus on enhancing democratic legitimacy and defining subsidiarity as a dimension of European integration;

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Economic policy

5. Welcomes the fact that the Cardiff European Council, in bringing forward the process decided in Luxembourg, considered the national employment plans, thus contributing to speeding up the process through their implementation; calls on the Member States urgently to improve and to implement the national employment plans and the measures contained in them;
6. Notes the orientations to guide the European Council's future work on employment which should include the strengthening of action on equal opportunities, but asks nevertheless that these orientations be translated into specific proposals for action;
7. Calls on the Commission and the Council to work in parallel in developing both the employment and the macro-economic guidelines, in order to transform the expected sustained growth into jobs;
8. Welcomes the fact that the social partners were invited to an exchange of views with the troika on the eve of the European Council and welcomes the intention of the Austrian Presidency to organize in November 1998 a seminar with the social partners to explore further ways of improving social dialogue;
9. Notes that the Commission's draft recommendation on the broad economic policy guidelines was watered down even before it was submitted to the European Council and no longer includes recommendations for each individual country, even though closer coordination of Member States' economic policies is required in the context of the smooth functioning of Economic and Monetary Union;

Enlargement/Agenda 2000

10. Notes that the Cardiff European Council has simply proposed an outline timetable for the Agenda 2000 proposals on developing the reform of the CAP, the Structural and Cohesion Funds and future financing, and calls in this connection for the Vienna European Council in December 1998 to reach an overall political agreement on these issues, thereby enabling the completion of the legislative procedures on all aspects of Agenda 2000 in good time before the next European elections;

Environment

11. With regard to the report prepared by the Commission on the integration of environment and sustainability into other policies as an overall topic, asks the Council to request the Commission to propose binding legislation on the integration of environment and sustainability and on consumer protection in the form of a framework Directive, and that progress in this field should be further evaluated and appropriate decisions taken at the Vienna European Council in December 1998;

Justice and Home Affairs

12. Takes note of the Council's intention to develop a new drugs strategy for 2000-2004 and urges the Council to inform and consult Parliament about this and any other initiative it may take in future with third countries in the field of Justice and Home Affairs;
13. Regrets that, against all justified expectations, Europol will not be operational from 1 July 1998 since this requires not only the Convention but also the Protocol to be fully ratified; regrets once again the absence of any progress on the jurisdiction of the European Court of Justice and on parliamentary scrutiny concerning the Europol Convention;

External issues

14. Calls on the Council and the Member States to do their utmost to bring about the creation of a credible, effective and independent International Criminal Court at the diplomatic conference that opened in Rome on 15 June 1998;
15. Notes the overall conclusions of the EU/US Summit of 18 May 1998, in particular the developments concerning the Helms Burton/D'Amato Acts, while regretting the shortcomings of the compromise reached on this issue; reiterates its strong opposition to extra-territorial laws of this nature and calls for consolidation of the European common position on this matter;

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16. Commends the common decision set down in the Declaration adopted at the Cardiff European Council on Kosovo and the European Council's promotion of a full range of options allowing for a strong and rapid response to the developing situation in close coordination with other international organizations;

17. Applauds the efforts undertaken in the Middle East by the British Presidency and the United States to persuade all the parties concerned to support the American proposals put forward at the recent meetings in London;

18. Invites the Council to reply positively and rapidly to the new South African trade proposals, by itself improving the trading offer *vis-à-vis* South Africa to allow a rapid and fair conclusion of negotiations;

Other issues

19. Very warmly welcomes the conclusions of the European Council concerning the peace process in Ireland and keenly hopes that that process can continue to evolve in the right direction, thanks in particular to the provision of appropriate financial resources and solidarity on the part of European countries;

20. Urges the Council to support fully a common statute for MEPs as provided for in the Amsterdam Treaty; in the meantime, commits itself to establishing a system whereby all allowances for MEPs reflect actual costs;

21. Is disappointed that, following the recent ruling of the Court of Justice on legal bases for the authorization of expenditure by the Commission, the Council and the Commission did not take a decision on the legal bases required to implement the EU's priority programmes and projects which qualify for funding under these programmes and which have a particularly positive impact among the people of Europe; calls on the Council to agree, within the framework of the dialogue, on intermediate measures in order to guarantee the financing of vital projects;

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8. Nuclear tests by India and Pakistan

Resolution on nuclear testing by India and Pakistan

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its previous resolutions on nuclear non-proliferation, nuclear testing and the work of the Canberra Commission for a nuclear weapon-free world,
 - having regard to the terms of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT),
 - having regard to the terms of the Comprehensive Nuclear Test-Ban Treaty (CTBT),
 - having regard to the statements made by the Council of the European Union, the G7, the UN Security Council and the meeting of the five permanent members of the Security Council,
- A. whereas the signatories of the Non-Proliferation Treaty have committed themselves to the objective of the elimination of all nuclear weapons,
- B. whereas over the past decades the two main nuclear powers have reduced the number of their nuclear warheads and envisage continuing this reduction through a number of bilateral agreements,
- C. whereas these reductions do not, as yet, point to rapid progress towards full elimination of these weapons,
- D. noting with great concern that India carried out five nuclear tests during the period 11-13 May 1998,
- E. noting with great concern that Pakistan then carried out six nuclear tests during the period 28-30 May 1998,
- F. whereas on 6 June 1998 the UN Security Council unanimously condemned these tests and called for both countries to refrain from further testing and sign the CTBT and the NPT,
- G. noting that these tests have caused a serious escalation in tension between the two countries and are an additional threat to peace and security on the continent as a whole; noting that this situation could deteriorate further if both countries continue to direct their nuclear capacity towards the manufacture of weapons,
- H. noting that a number of countries, including some EU Member States, the United States and Japan, have decided to impose sanctions on both countries in response to these nuclear tests,
- I. noting that both countries already allocate a disproportionate part of both their GNP and their budget on military spending and on military, nuclear research and development,
- J. whereas the nuclear tests are likely to damage both the Pakistani and Indian economies, in view of their effect on foreign loans and investment, which in turn will affect the already low social condition of the population,
- K. emphasizing that in order to strengthen stability and security in the region and in the world as a whole it is necessary for India and Pakistan on the one hand to adhere to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty without any modification thereof, and on the other hand to adhere to the Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty immediately and unconditionally, thus facilitating its entry into force,
- L. noting the unanimous conclusion of the International Court of Justice that there is an obligation to pursue in good faith and bring to a conclusion negotiations leading to nuclear disarmament in all its aspects under strict international control,

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1. Condemns the recent nuclear tests carried out in May 1998 by India and then by Pakistan and expresses its deep concern about the danger to peace, security and stability in the region and in the world as a whole provoked by these tests; remains convinced that the NPT and the CTBT are the cornerstones of the global non-proliferation regime and the essential bases for progress towards nuclear disarmament;
2. Urges the Indian and Pakistani Governments to refrain from any further nuclear tests, to adhere to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty without any modification of this Treaty and to adhere to the Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty immediately and unconditionally;
3. Calls on the Indian and Pakistani Governments to give a commitment immediately not to assemble or deploy nuclear weapons and devices, and to halt the development of ballistic missiles capable of carrying nuclear warheads;
4. Calls on the Indian and Pakistani Governments to start talks immediately to reduce tension in the region, to establish a framework for reconciliation and cooperation and thus to promote peace, security and stability in South Asia and throughout the continent; calls on the Council and the Member States to assist the Governments of India and Pakistan, where necessary and possible, in this process of reconciliation and cooperation, possibly by (co-)sponsoring a regional conference on security and confidence-building measures;
5. Calls on the Council and the Member States to prevent the export of equipment, materials and/or technology that could in any way assist programmes in India or Pakistan for nuclear weapons or for ballistic missiles capable of carrying such weapons;
6. Calls on Member States which have not yet done so to ratify the Comprehensive Nuclear Test-Ban Treaty immediately, in order to facilitate its entry into force as soon as possible;
7. Calls on the five nuclear weapons states to interpret their Treaty obligations as an urgent commitment to the total elimination of their nuclear weapons;
8. Asks the Council and the Commission to examine ways and means to promote further progress towards the gradual elimination of nuclear weapons and calls on the Council to present a regular progress report to Parliament;
9. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council, the governments of the Member States, the UN Security Council and the Governments and Parliaments of India and Pakistan.

9. War between Ethiopia and Eritrea

Resolution on the conflict between Ethiopia and Eritrea

The European Parliament,

- A. deploring the outbreak of military hostilities between the Republic of Eritrea and the Republic of Ethiopia, and whereas the cause of the war is the absence of an agreement over the demarcation of the frontier,
- B. recalling that after Eritrean independence in 1993, a boundary commission was set up and was meeting without major incident until a few days before the military clash took place in May 1998,
- C. deploring the recent bombing raids on both sides that caused the loss of many lives among the civilian population and forced part of the population to flee,
- D. whereas the people of Ethiopia and Eritrea suffered for a long time under a totalitarian dictatorship, which they threw off by means of a long and bloody war, ended by a peaceful separation, following which the two governments have cooperated on a number of occasions,

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- E. concerned at the danger that the conflict may escalate, despite the many efforts at mediation since it broke out, and that, unless a peaceful solution is found quickly, this conflict could destabilize the region and result in a tragedy which would affect the populations of the Horn of Africa as a whole,
- F. regretting that, during the almost 40 days since the war broke out, the Council has merely issued condemnations and appeals similar to this resolution, without taking any other action under the common foreign and security policy,
- G. whereas much of the population of both Ethiopia and Eritrea live in miserable conditions in terms of nutrition, health and educational facilities; whereas a war between the two neighbouring countries will definitely worsen the prevailing social conditions of the two states,
1. Condemns the escalation of violence between Ethiopia and Eritrea and urges both parties to adhere to the ceasefire and to find a just and peaceful settlement to their frontier dispute and, in this context, to cooperate fully with the international mediation efforts brokered by the OAU, the United States and Rwanda;
2. Considers that the territorial conflict between these two countries must be settled by negotiation; invites the Governments of Ethiopia and Eritrea to initiate diplomatic negotiations in order to find a peaceful and political solution to the problems between the two parties, and urges the two parties to settle the border dispute through the boundary commission and/or through the International Court of Justice;
3. Supports the mediation efforts undertaken at international level and calls on the Council of the European Union and on the Organisation of African Unity to put pressure on the two countries to accept a political settlement of this conflict;
4. Calls on the Commission to prepare adequate emergency aid in order to help all populations affected by the conflict and to deal with the massive displacement of refugees;
5. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the ACP-EU Joint Assembly, the United Nations, the OAU and the Governments of Ethiopia, Eritrea, the United States, Rwanda and Djibouti.

Resolution on the question of the death penalty and the establishment of a universal moratorium on executions

— having regard to its previous resolutions on the death penalty,

- A. whereas in 1994 the United Nations General Assembly rejected by only eight votes a resolution on the establishment of a universal moratorium on the death penalty,

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- B. recalling the 1997 resolution of the UN Commission on Human Rights (E/CN.4/1997/L.20) which maintains that 'abolition of the death penalty contributes to the enhancement of human dignity and to the progressive development of human rights',
 - C. recalling the resolution of the UN Commission on Human Rights of 3 April 1998, (E/CN.4/1998/L.12) which calls for the establishment of a universal moratorium on executions;
 - D. welcoming the latest report of the UN Secretary-General which contains information on changes and positive developments in law and practice concerning the death penalty world-wide (E/CN.4/1998/82),
 - E. welcoming the fact that several countries, while still keeping the death penalty in their legislation, are applying a de facto moratorium on executions,
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- 1. Calls on the Member States to undertake all necessary steps to ensure that the question of the death penalty is included on the agenda of the next session of the UN General Assembly;
 - 2. Requests the Council to give a mandate to the Austrian Presidency to coordinate the initiatives of the EU Member States concerning the inclusion of a universal moratorium on executions on the agenda of the next session of the UN General Assembly;
 - 3. Calls on the Council, the Member States and the Commission, acting within their respective remits, to table at the next UN General Assembly a resolution for the introduction of a universal moratorium on executions;
 - 4. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council, the governments of the Member States, the UN Secretary-General and the President of the UN General Assembly.

Resolution on the death sentences passed in Equatorial Guinea

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its previous resolutions on the human rights situation in Equatorial Guinea,
 - having regard to its previous resolutions supporting the abolition of the death penalty and recalling its repeated condemnation of the possibility of people losing their lives by virtue of a court decision,

- A. dismayed at the verdict in the summary trial held in Equatorial Guinea which includes death sentences against 15 persons and a number of prison sentences ranging from 6 to 26 years,
 - B. whereas the judicial proceedings against 117 persons of the Bubi ethnic minority accused of terrorism, secession and treason were not accompanied by the minimum guarantees which might be demanded from a state governed by the rule of law, as revealed by statements made by defence lawyers and information published in the free media,
 - C. condemning the harassment of the Western press by the authorities of Equatorial Guinea and the expulsion of the journalists following the proceedings,
 - D. regretting that Equatorial Guinea has made no progress towards democracy, disregarding its own international commitments and in particular those linking it to the European Union,
 - E. recalling that the consolidation of democracy and the rule of law and respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms are fundamental principles governing the European Union's external action,

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1. Rejects the death sentences passed against 15 of the accused and calls on the country's authorities immediately to commute them to custodial sentences and to stage an impartial retrial of the 117 Bubi militants in the presence of international observers;
 2. Urges the Government of Equatorial Guinea to embark without delay on the steps necessary to establish the rule of law, democratic freedoms, respect for human rights and for minority rights;
 3. Calls on the Commission to reconsider cooperation links with Equatorial Guinea until the authorities there have provided convincing proof of their resolve to make progress towards democracy;
 4. Calls on the Commission and Council to apply the democratic conditionality clause in all the European Union's relations with Equatorial Guinea, with the exception of humanitarian aid;
 5. Calls on the Government of Equatorial Guinea to ensure that the use of torture is stopped and to ratify the United Nations Convention against torture as soon as possible;
 6. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council, the governments of the Member States and the Government of Equatorial Guinea.

Resolution on the human rights situation in East Timor and Indonesia

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its previous resolutions on East Timor and Indonesia,
 - having regard to the UN resolutions on East Timor,
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- A. whereas, despite a number of international appeals, the political situation in East Timor has not altered in the slightest,
 - B. whereas the fall of the dictator Suharto has created new expectations concerning moves towards democracy and respect for human rights in Indonesia and its annexed or occupied territories,
 - C. having regard to the recent statements by the new President Habibie concerning a special status for East Timor, which could include recognition of the territory's specific religious and cultural characteristics, even if the right to self-determination of the people of East Timor is still denied,
 - D. whereas the recent release of some political prisoners remains very selective,
 - E. having regard to the urgent need, which it has endorsed on a number of occasions, for serious and constructive negotiations to be initiated between the parties concerned so as to definitively resolve the political problem of East Timor,
 - F. whereas the EU Member States, via the IMF, are responsible for the biggest contribution in terms of financial aid to the resolution of the economic crisis in Indonesia,
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1. Notes the recent moves to greater political openness in Indonesia resulting both from internal pressure and the resistance of the Timorese people and from diplomatic action by the international community, in particular the EU and Portugal, the administrative power; regrets the very limited nature of those moves, and, above all, the failure to release the majority of the political prisoners;

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2. Calls on the Indonesian authorities to proceed to the immediate and unconditional release of Xanana Gusmão and all the other political prisoners, whether or not they are of Timorese origin, and under no circumstances to treat them as common criminals;
3. Calls on the Indonesian authorities to pursue democratic reforms in as rapid and consolidated fashion as possible, to set a date for free and democratic elections without delay and to satisfy the demands underlying the mass protests which led to the present situation, especially as regards improving the people's living conditions and fighting corruption;
4. Calls on the Indonesian Government to refrain from violence of any kind against peaceful demonstrations;
5. Calls, in the context of the changes underway in Indonesia, for firm and determined action for a peaceful solution to the East Timor problem and for self-determination for the people of the territory, on the basis of respect for international law and the UN resolutions;
6. Calls on the Indonesian government to carry out a full investigation into all cases of human rights abuses, and to take judicial action against their perpetrators;
7. Reiterates the position expressed in its resolution of 21 November 1991 on the massacre in East Timor ⁽¹⁾, namely that a delegation should be sent to East Timor; insists that the Indonesian Government must, once and for all, take steps to enable the delegation's visit to take place;
8. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the parliaments of the Member States, the Government of Indonesia, the UN Secretary-General, the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights, the Nobel Peace Prize winners Ramos Horta and Ximenes Belo, and the leader of the Timorese resistance, Xanana Gusmão.

Resolution on Chad

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its previous resolutions on the situation in Chad,
- A. having regard to the serious human rights violations in Chad since October 1997 which reached their peak with the massacre of 100 unarmed civilians in the Logone region in march 1998, along with executions, arbitrary arrests and torture by the Chadian security forces, as denounced by Amnesty International and Chadian human rights organizations,
 - B. whereas Ngarledji Yorongar, an opposition member of parliament, was arrested on 2 June 1998 on charges of defamation,
 - C. deeply concerned about the recent arrests of the journalists Koumbo Synga and Polycarpe Togamessi,
 - D. whereas Mr Yorongar has been a strong critic of the Chad-Cameroon oil extraction and pipeline project, which is led by an international consortium and is awaiting World Bank approval which is conditional on the conclusion of an environmental impact assessment due before the autumn,
 - E. whereas the international consortium has stated in public that it will not proceed with this project without World Bank involvement,
 - F. noting the vulnerability of the local communities in the area covered by the project due to the persistent political instability and human rights violations; noting also the importance of the region for the country's agriculture,
1. Urges the Council, the Commission and the Member States to put pressure on the Chad Government to respect human rights and the rule of law throughout the country and to suspend immediately military activities in the southern region;

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2. Calls for the immediate release of Ngarledji Yorongar and urges the Chadian Government to respect democratic discussion on the situation in the country as well as on the planned oil project in the Doba region;
 3. Calls on the Chad Government and the international consortium to proceed with the oil extraction project only if the World Bank assessment is positive, and to provide the following guarantees among others:
 - improved public dissemination of information regarding the oil project;
 - protection of indigenous peoples and adequate compensation for displaced local populations in strict respect for human rights;
 - the most stringent environmental protection rules, including oil-spill prevention, pipeline routing, air quality, disease control and accident prevention;
 - local re-investment of an adequate share of the revenue from the project;
 4. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the governments of the Member States, the Chad and Cameroon Governments and Parliaments and the World Bank.

Resolution on the blasphemy laws in Pakistan

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the consultation on the cooperation agreement between the European Union and Pakistan, which has already been initialled, and in which human rights and democratic principles are laid down as fundamental conditions of the agreement,
 - having regard to the United Nations Human Rights Charter,
- A. concerned at the effects of the 1991 blasphemy law, which has frequently led to death sentences being passed and severe penalties being imposed on members of religious minorities,
 - B. noting that this law has also led to acts of violence against religious minorities,
 - C. noting that members of these minorities are arrested, often held on remand awaiting trial for a very long time without reason and are subjected to severe penalties,
 - D. whereas representatives of the Catholic and Protestant churches and Moslems have repeatedly protested against the increased harshness of the law on blasphemy,
 - E. whereas the Human Rights Commission of Pakistan (HRCP) assessed 1997 as the worst year for human rights in the history of the country,
 - F. whereas the blasphemy law in Pakistan is frequently abused to settle personal disputes,
 - G. whereas it is noteworthy that the death of Catholic Bishop John Joseph is being seen as a symbol of the protest against the deterioration of the situation of religious minorities,

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1. Calls for the immediate revision of the blasphemy law, which has also been called for by the various representatives of the churches in Pakistan;
 2. Calls for the revision of the separate electoral law for religious minorities and religious communities, in consultation with the representatives of the religious minorities, in order to ensure greater representation of these minorities;
 3. Protests against the arrest of members of religious minorities who protest against the religious laws;
 4. Calls for an end to threats to political and religious organizations and institutions, judges, lawyers and spokesmen of NGOs who advocate a change in the law;
 5. Calls for the protection of people threatened by persecution and attacks by religious fanatics and for fair trials for all accused persons;
 6. Calls on the Commission, in the implementation of the cooperation agreement which is shortly to be concluded, to ensure together with the Pakistan authorities that respect for human rights also covers the right to freedom of religion;
 7. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission and the Government and Parliament of Pakistan.

Resolution on the situation in Guinea-Bissau

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the declaration of 8 June 1998 by the Presidency of the Union,
 - having regard to the meeting of Portuguese-speaking African countries held in Lisbon on 17 June 1998,
- A. having regard to the revolt that has brought loyalist soldiers into conflict with rebel troops since 7 June 1998,
 - B. having regard to the military intervention by Senegal and Guinea in an effort to quell the rebellion led by General Mane, former chief of staff of the armed forces, who was sacked following the discovery of arms trafficking to the Casamance rebels,
 - C. whereas severe losses have been sustained by both forces loyal to the government and the rebels,
 - D. whereas the clashes between the rebels and government troops have also claimed the lives of more than 100 civilians and have forced some of the population to flee, putting their lives in danger,
 - E. whereas the African heads of state meeting in Ougadougou for the OAU summit have given their support to President Nino Vieira,
 - F. aware of the devastating effects that the continuation of this crisis could have on the stability of West Africa and concerned to prevent an escalation of fighting in the region,
1. Condemns the attempted coup by certain elements of the armed forces against the democratic institutions and President Vieira and calls for constitutional order to be restored;
 2. Calls on the warring parties to put an immediate end to hostilities and to declare and respect a ceasefire;
 3. Regrets that the fighting has already claimed the lives of hundreds of victims among both the civilian population and the combatants;
 4. Calls on the OAU to offer to mediate without delay in order to resolve the conflict peacefully;

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5. Calls on the Council of the European Union to promote any initiative aimed at a peaceful and rapid solution to the crisis, particularly within the framework of the United Nations and the OAU;
6. Welcomes the humanitarian aid that the European Union has just released to help the population; calls on it to provide assistance to the neighbouring countries that will have to cope with the influx of refugees from Guinea-Bissau;
7. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the ACP-EU Council, the Co-Presidents of the ACP-EU Joint Assembly, the UN and OAU secretaries-general and the Government of Guinea-Bissau.

11. International Criminal Court

Resolution on the International Criminal Court

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its previous resolutions on an International Criminal Court,
- A. whereas it is necessary to establish a permanent International Criminal Court to complement national legal systems and to end the impunity enjoyed by perpetrators of genocide, crimes against humanity and war crimes,
 - B. whereas the UN Commission on Human Rights strongly supports the establishment of such a Court,
 - C. whereas the preparatory phase for the establishment of the International Criminal Court was completed at the last session of the UN Preparatory Committee from 16 March to 3 April 1998,
 - D. welcoming the increased participation of states in the negotiating process, and hoping to see an ever greater participation of states from all regions fully represented at the Rome Diplomatic Conference,
 - E. whereas the Diplomatic Conference of Plenipotentiaries for the Establishment of an International Criminal Court is being held in Rome from 15 June to 17 July 1998,
 - F. whereas the Member States and the European Commission delegation taking part in the Rome Diplomatic Conference can play a critical role in ensuring a successful conclusion of the Diplomatic Conference in Rome and welcoming the increased convergence of EU Member States' positions,
 - G. welcoming the offer by the Government of the Netherlands to host the permanent International Criminal Court,
1. Calls on the Rome Diplomatic Conference to take this historic opportunity to conclude the text of a Statute for an independent, fair and effective International Criminal Court;
 2. Calls on the Member States, the Council and the Commission to be active in ensuring a successful outcome, i.e. the establishment of an effective International Criminal Court, and not to compromise on essential points of principle in efforts to conciliate reluctant states;
 3. Stresses that the Statute of the permanent International Criminal Court to be finalised at the Rome Conference, in order to represent an effective complement to national judicial systems, must provide for:
 - (a) an independent prosecutor able to initiate and conduct investigations and prosecutions, on an own-initiative basis, in situations where the core crimes under the jurisdiction of the court have been committed,
 - (b) the Court's inherent and universal jurisdiction on the core crimes of genocide, crimes against humanity and war crimes without any state consent requirement,

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- (c) a good working relationship with the existing International Courts already established in The Hague,
 - (d) a constructive relationship with the United Nations, and in particular with the Security Council, in full recognition of their respective roles and competences,
 - (e) the obligation of States Parties to comply without delay with orders and decisions of the Court,
 - (f) the highest standards of respect for the rights of the accused and of the suspects and the protection of the interests of victims and witnesses,
 - (g) the guarantee of long-term financing to ensure the Court's self-reliance and independence from any external pressure;
4. Stresses furthermore that the Court's jurisdiction over the core crimes of genocide, crimes against humanity and war crimes should apply to the same range of criminal acts whether they are committed in international or intranational armed conflict;
5. Calls on the Council and the Member States to ensure the universality and transparency of the negotiations and the continued participation of the international legal community and civil society;
6. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the governments of the Member States, the Secretary-General of the United Nations, the President of the United Nations General Assembly and the President of the UN Diplomatic Conference for the Establishment of the International Criminal Court.

Resolution on Cambodia

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its previous resolutions on Cambodia,
 - having regard to the 1991 Paris Peace Accords,
- A. whereas since the Co-Prime Minister Hun Sen staged a coup and took charge of the capital at the end of July 1997, human rights abuses have been widely committed in the country and opponents and independent journalists are constantly harassed by the authorities, while a climate of fear and impunity are the main obstacles to the restoration of dialogue in Cambodia,
- B. whereas fresh elections have been called for 26 July 1998 in order to provide stability for the country,
- C. whereas the Commission has announced funding of ECU 9,5 million for preparations for the Cambodian elections,
- D. whereas such aid is intended to train Cambodian polling officers, inform voters and local journalists and send independent observers,
- E. deploring the fact that this aid has been announced, even though there is little evidence so far that the Cambodian elections will be fair and free,
- F. concerned by the general climate of intimidation which prevents the enjoyment of fundamental freedoms such as freedom of speech and assembly,
- G. whereas equal access to the media is not granted to all political parties and candidates and whereas access is mainly reserved for the Hun Sen group,
- H. whereas the composition of the Constitutional Council is not balanced and it is unable fully to exercise its authority,
- I. whereas some political parties, such as the Democratic Party, have been denied participation in the 1998 elections despite the fact that they were registered for the 1993 elections,

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1. Believes that the Cambodian Government will enjoy international recognition and credibility only if elected on the basis of fair and free elections;
2. Calls on Hun Sen and all factions fully to respect and implement the Paris Agreement, which provides a comprehensive framework for reconciliation and stability in Cambodia;
3. Urges Hun Sen in particular to implement without any further delay measures including:
 - effective and equal access to the media and licence freedom for radio stations;
 - composition of the Constitutional Council according to the law, enabling it to operate legally and in a neutral way;
 - participation of all parties registered in 1993;
 - substantial progress on the investigations into political violence;
4. Urges Hun Sen immediately to end the campaign of intimidation against opposition parties and candidates;
5. Reiterates its call to the Commission to link the release of the allocated funds for the elections to the implementation of the conditions set out in its resolution of 12 March 1998 ⁽¹⁾;
6. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the United Nations, ASEAN and the authorities of Cambodia.

**Resolution on the Commission communication: Energy for the future: renewable sources of energy
— White Paper for a Community Strategy and Action Plan (COM(97)0599 — C4-0047/98)**

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Commission communication (COM(97)0599 — C4-0047/98),
- having regard to the protocol of 10 December 1997 of the third conference of the parties to the Framework Convention on Climate Change held in Kyoto in which the European Union committed itself to an 8% reduction of CO₂ emissions by comparison with 1990 levels by the middle of the next decade, and having regard to the protocol's Article 2(1)(iv) in which the signatories undertake to promote research and development and increased use of renewable energies,
- having regard to its resolutions of 4 July 1996 on a Community action plan for renewable energy sources ⁽¹⁾, 15 May 1997 on the Commission's Green Paper 'Energy for the Future: renewable sources of energy' ⁽²⁾ and 19 February 1998 on environmental policy and climate change following the Kyoto summit ⁽³⁾,

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- having regard to the conclusions of the meetings of the Environment Ministers of 3 March, 16 October and 16 December 1997,
 - having regard to the report of the Committee on Research, Technological Development and Energy and the opinions of the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development, the Committee on Regional Policy and the Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Consumer Protection (A4-0207/98),
- A. whereas meeting the rapidly increasing global demand for energy through fossil fuels is placing the climate at further risk and whereas at Kyoto the European Union agreed to a reduction of CO₂ emissions throughout the Union by 8% in relation to 1990 emissions by the middle of the next decade,
- B. whereas the contribution of renewable energies to the EU's energy consumption is, at 8% (on the substitution principle), well below the technical potential and whereas the various Member States make widely differing use of the possibilities available so that regional and secure sources of energy which could contribute to security of supply are not being utilized,
- C. whereas the Commission's promotion of a 15% contribution by renewable energy sources to gross inland energy consumption (under the substitution principle) in the EU in 2010 requires efforts to be made and will only be possible through close cooperation between the Union and the Member States,
- D. whereas, in order to achieve this objective, it is essential to reach agreement quickly at European and Member State level on a comprehensive strategy and on its rapid and monitored implementation on the basis of assessable goals,
- E. whereas the generally recognized need to save fossil energy sources is not reflected in an appropriately high market price for these resources and whereas the proposal 'Restructuring the Community framework for the taxation of energy products' (COM(97)0030) also does not internalize the external costs of burning fossil energy sources to any great extent; whereas the new technologies must maintain their position in an energy market which is characterized by technologies optimized over many decades and by plants which have already been depreciated in some cases; whereas it can therefore not be expected that, in the foreseeable future, technical progress alone will be sufficient to establish the competitiveness of renewable energy sources on the energy markets,
- F. whereas it is therefore crucial firstly to ensure lasting internalization of external costs or, alternatively, to grant renewable energies a premium for their environmental and social value, secondly, to guarantee fair access for renewable energies to the electricity networks and thirdly, to use state aid to help the new technologies during the market introduction phase to break into the market; whereas the 'Campaign for take-off' proposed in the White Paper is very significant in this context,
- G. whereas, as part of a strategy for renewable energy sources, harmonized European provisions are needed, in particular with regard to taxes, the payment for electricity fed in from renewable energy sources and technical standards, in order to prepare a reliable legal framework for the development and use of renewable energy sources and also to avoid distortions of competition in the internal market,
- H. whereas the proposal under the White Paper for the tripling of biomass used for energy purposes so that it would make the largest contribution to achieving the overall objective, can be carried out only by means of special agricultural policy measures,
- I. whereas the proposals for the reform of agricultural policy under Agenda 2000, including the far-reaching reversal of compulsory set-aside and the lack of adequate replacement measures to promote energy crops, are incompatible with the objectives of the White Paper,

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- J. whereas the provision in the White Paper for the use of about 10 million hectares for energy crops requires steps to be taken as quickly as possible as otherwise even the existing biomass industry would collapse with the cessation of the compulsory set-aside policy,
- K. whereas the White Paper provides for 15-fold growth in the thermal use of solar energy, but does not propose any support measures for it; whereas solar thermal energy is almost fully mature and its spread depends to a large extent on the extent of public awareness and information,
- L. whereas renewable energy sources create jobs, in particular in small and medium-sized undertakings, open up new export markets for modern technologies, produce major fossil fuel cost savings in the economy and thus improve the Union's trade balance,
- M. whereas in the medium term a very extensive switch to the intrinsically decentralised renewable energies is needed and whereas, therefore, account must already be taken of future structural suitability at the planning and promotion stage at all levels and in all programmes; whereas nothing should be approved or promoted which hampers such a switch; whereas, in all new construction measures, account should be taken of optimal conditions for combined heat and power and the installation of solar units,
- N. whereas renewable energies meet with great approval among the European public and considerable forces could be released through information and motivation of the population, as shown by the positive experiences in some Member States,
- O. whereas popular support is essential for the development of renewable energies and whereas therefore in all measures, and in order to reduce costs as rapidly as possible, consideration must be given to a sensitive approach to the countryside and broad popular acceptance,
- P. whereas over the last four decades the Euratom Treaty has proved an effective instrument for promoting nuclear energy and whereas similar success is needed for renewable sources of energy,
- Q. whereas the Commission's White Paper with the Action Plan is a welcome basis for a Community strategy for renewable sources of energy,
- R. whereas the White Paper, together with the additions called for in the paragraphs below, must be implemented as quickly as possible,
1. Considers the target of doubling the contribution of renewable energy to total energy consumption by 15% (under the substitution principle) by 2010 as a minimum objective and expects Member States to give binding undertakings on national overall goals and targets for each type of energy; the target for the amount of electricity to be produced from renewable energy should be given as a specific individual target; emphasizes that the possibility set out in the White Paper of that target being subsequently reviewed⁽¹⁾ must not result in the established target being watered down and that any revision must be upwards;
2. Calls on the Commission to examine by the end of 1998 at the latest the suitability of national plans for achieving the Community objective and if necessary to initiate additional activities geared toward a minimum national increase of 7%;
3. Calls on the Commission in future when calculating energy balances to use the substitution principle which gives a more reliable indication of CO₂ reductions;

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4. Shares the Commission's view that the promotion of renewable energy sources should also be incorporated into other policies and calls on the Commission, therefore, to ensure that, when the Community strategy is implemented, account is taken not only of the European energy policy but also of other policy areas such as the environment, agriculture, regional development and transport, as well as fiscal policy, economic policy and external trade, with the issue being clarified of how coordination will be managed inside the Commission and the form in which all the relevant protagonists (regions, NGOs and businesses) can be involved;
5. Calls on the Commission to submit by 30 June 1999 at the latest a new proposal for a Community energy-related taxation model, which gives practical effect to the principle of the internalization of external costs set out in the White Paper on Growth, Competitiveness and Employment and exempts renewable sources of energy;
6. Calls on the Commission to define the external costs of energy production clearly and to set out what costs must in any case be included in the price calculation;
7. Calls on the Commission to submit by 31 December 1998 at the latest a proposal for a Community provision on inputs to the grid based on the right to feed in electricity from renewable energies at a nationally determined minimum price;
8. Considers that, in view of the new agricultural policy proposals, the tripling of the use of biomass for energy purposes put forward in the White Paper will be difficult to achieve; calls, therefore, for much greater efforts in the field of electric/thermal-solar energy use;
9. Expects that the diametrically opposed approaches set out in the White Paper on renewable sources of energy and in the proposals for the reform of the common agricultural policy will be resolved by integrating agricultural production for the production of electricity, heat and fuels into the market organization policy;
10. Calls, *inter alia*, for the following measures to be introduced:
 - addition of perennial plants for the energy sector as the fifth group in Annex I of Regulation (EEC) No 1765/92;
 - an additional premium, degressive over time, to be granted for the growing of energy crops, which will gradually be replaced by a grant paid from energy taxes so that the area premium is higher than that for cereals;
 - immediate change of Regulation (EEC) No 2078/92 with the aim of allowing additional national premiums for the planting of energy crops;
 - creation of special incentives for the cultivation of perennial plantations;
 - consideration of the energy uses of biomass in a new Directive on European forestry strategy, as already called for in its resolution of 30 January 1997 on the European Union's forestry strategy (¹);
11. Sees further opportunities for using and saving energy by better exploiting agricultural waste products such as biogas, organic fertilizers, composting and shavings, biomass (straw, beet waste, etc.) in a process of re-utilization;
12. Calls on the Commission, in the implementation of the action plan for biomass use, to aim at a minimum of 50% combined heat and power by 2010; calls, in the framework of the campaign for biomass, for emphasis to be placed on innovative technologies for small thermal power stations burning solid biomass with combined heat and power;
13. Calls on the Commission to ensure that renewable energy sources are used in an ecologically sensible fashion in order to prevent, for example, a situation where the planting of energy crops results in the creation of extensive monocultures or where the use of wind turbines results in a reduction in the diversity of animal species;

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14. Calls on the Commission to include in the Action Plan a pilot project to promote the use of fuel obtained from biomass, with the aim of increasing the market share to 2% over 5 years, either through financial aid for the processing industry or through an obligation on the oil companies for the admixture of a certain minimum proportion of fuel from biomass; considers that there should also be additional exemption from mineral oil taxes for mixed fuels to aid entry into the market;
15. Calls on the Commission, in its Action Plan for renewable energies, to include new types of financing which can generally be implemented as 'financial engineering';
16. Calls on the Commission to review the applicability of more extensive measures to promote renewable energy sources in the field of regional planning as well (e.g. the Danish Regional Planning Act);
17. Notes that greater use of energy generated from renewable energy sources makes a decisive contribution to improvements in air, water and soil quality and emphasizes that conversion to renewable energy sources plays a significant role in the measures designed to attain the reduction in greenhouse gases agreed in Kyoto; calls on the Commission, therefore, to take account of that fact in the Commission communication on the 'European Bubble' currently being drawn up;
18. Calls on the Commission to incorporate the measures set out in the Community strategy into the preparatory work involving the applicant countries, with commensurate funds being made available under the PHARE Programme;
19. Expects as part of the reform of the structural policy that, with the key structural policy areas being 'employment' and 'sustainable development', particular account will be taken of renewable sources of energy in the guidelines for the operational programmes;
20. Considers that providing energy is a public service and that, particularly in remote and island areas where transport and infrastructure construction costs are high, it is worth promoting the use of renewable energy sources and decentralized energy production significantly more than at present by means of the EU's Structural Funds and Member States' own measures;
21. Calls on the Commission to regard the promotion of renewable energy sources as a priority issue during the forthcoming budgetary procedure and to enter sufficient funds for the implementation of the Community strategy for renewable energy sources right from the preliminary draft budget stage, with at least the same level of appropriations being entered as those currently earmarked for fusion research;
22. Calls for a clear increase in funding for the Altener programme in the energy framework programme, in particular for targeted actions (Article 2(e), Altener II), and for a clear increase in the percentage in the research and demonstration programmes of the fifth framework research programme benefiting renewable energies;
23. Considers that energy research should include research into the regional, socio-economic and ecological impact of the use of the various energy sources;
24. Calls on the Commission to gear the Synergy programme even more strongly towards renewable and decentralized energy sources;
25. Considers it necessary to develop joint ventures with third countries in the developing world, to facilitate the export of EU renewable energy technology and to make use of existing EU development programmes to achieve maximum effect;
26. Calls on the Commission to take sufficient account of the economic, social and environmental opportunities offered by the use of renewable energy, in particular in all development cooperation programmes;
27. Calls on the Commission to include the option of combined combustion of biomass and coal as part of the multiannual programme to promote the clean and efficient use of solid fuels, in the support measures and in the information network which is being developed; considers that innovative technologies for combined combustion should also be taken into account in the Carnot project proposed in the energy framework programme and in the funding from the ECSC reserve intended for coal research;

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28. Calls, in the forthcoming drafting of an action plan for the use of country-specific funds from the MEDA programme, for a focus on the exchange of information and experiences on renewable energies and in the guidelines for the operational programmes under PHARE and TACIS for a focus on awareness-raising measures for renewable energies;
 29. Calls on the Commission to report regularly to Parliament on the proportion accounted for by renewable energies in the funding provided under the Structural Funds and the Community programmes in the period under review;
 30. Calls on the Commission to implement the measures proposed in the White Paper to strengthen the role of the European financial institutions (EIB, EBRD); considers that measures for additional interest rate subsidies should be carried out at EU level and at Member State level;
 31. Calls on the EIB to finance more projects for the reduction of CO₂ emissions through renewable energies;
 32. Welcomes the proposed campaign for the take-off in the areas of photovoltaics, wind energy and biomass use and the 'integration of renewable energies in 100 communities' project; calls on the Commission and the Member States, following the immediate drawing up of a financial and substantive plan that also contains a broadly based information campaign for solar-thermal power in the areas of heating, cooling and hot service water production and the promotion of solar thermal power stations inside and outside the European Union with a capacity of 1 000 MWp, to start with practical implementation in 1998, with special attention being paid to close cooperation between municipalities, regions, Member States and the European Union;
 33. Calls on the Commission to propose a Directive with a view to limiting total emissions for cooling and heating, through the use of active and passive solar energy and energy-saving measures, to low CO₂ levels per square metre per year for new buildings and for renovated old buildings;
 34. Calls on the Member States to use a solar architecture action programme to integrate active and passive use of solar energy into its building legislation and to provide for a defined percentage of renewable energies in public construction projects;
 35. Expects a decision on improved use of renewable sources of energy in new building projects or refurbishment projects involving the Community's bodies — including the current European Parliament projects — which should lead to the bodies themselves making appropriate commitments;
 36. Expects a proposal for a Community information campaign, its aim being to provide general information on the environmental and economic usefulness of renewable energies and specialist information targeted at specific professional groups;
 37. Considers that the proposed support measures should also emphasize the impetus that can be provided by grass-roots organizations' information campaigns; stresses that network cooperation should also include cooperation with grass-roots organizations which can play a particularly dynamic role in the energy sector; points out that grass-roots organizations can also make a contribution as natural partners to the proposed campaign to promote renewable energy;
 38. Calls for 'golden sun' awards (similar to the blue flag award) to be made, commensurate with the use of renewable energies by holiday hotels, resorts and districts;
 39. Calls on the Council, during a future review of the EU Treaty, to incorporate in the Treaty a chapter devoted to energy, with appropriate account being taken of the promotion of renewable energy sources in order to ensure that a permanent and environmentally sound energy policy will be pursued at European level;
 40. Expects the preparation of a charter on renewable energies (Eurenew);
 41. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council and the governments of the Member States.
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14. Middle East peace process

Resolution on the situation in the Middle East

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its previous resolutions on the situation in the Middle East,
 - having regard to UN Security Council resolutions 242, 338 and 425,
 - having regard to the Council statements on the Middle East peace process,
 - having regard to the Commission communications on the role of the EU in the Middle East peace process and its aid contribution in the future, on the implementation of the Interim Agreement on Trade and Trade-related matters between the European Community and Israel and on the Euro-Mediterranean cumulation of rules of origin,
 - having regard to the final declaration of the Barcelona Euro-Mediterranean Conference and the Malta and Palermo Euro-Mediterranean Conferences,
- A. whereas the Middle East peace process is a fundamental element in guaranteeing peace and security throughout the entire Mediterranean area,
- B. having regard to the continuing deadlock in the Middle East peace process since the last Israeli elections in spite of recent attempts, including those by the European Union, to restart dialogue between the Israeli Government and the Palestinian Authority,
- C. whereas growing tensions are strengthening the most radical factions on both sides,
1. Reaffirms its support for the Oslo Agreements, based on the principle of 'land in exchange for peace' as the sole means of ensuring stability in the region and consequently the stable security of Israel and the full recognition of the rights of the Palestinians;
 2. Urges the Israeli Government to proceed with a withdrawal from the occupied territories consistent with its commitments under the Oslo accords, in order to contribute to the restoration of trust which is necessary for the peace process to move ahead and in which solutions must be sought to the final status issues (borders, settlements, refugees, Jerusalem and the definitive status of Palestine) by 4 May 1999, the date foreseen in the Oslo Agreements;
 3. Asks the Council and the Commission to make every effort to support this process, making full use of the EU's relationship with the parties concerned, including Syria and Lebanon, and the good offices of Mr Moratinos;
 4. Calls on the governments of Lebanon, Syria and Israel to revive and resume the peace negotiations at the point they had reached when they were broken off and in accordance with the relevant resolutions of the United Nations Security Council and the principles laid down at the Madrid Conference on the Middle East;
 5. Calls on the Council Presidency to take the necessary initiatives to allow the European Union to play its full role in promoting the Middle East peace process;
 6. Supports the implementation by the EU of a new package of measures aimed at countering terrorism and helping the Palestinian Authority to develop its capacity to combat terrorism, including the establishment of a joint EU/Palestinian security committee;
 7. Urges the Israeli Government to end the policy of settlement in the occupied territories, in order to create a climate of confidence between the two sides;
 8. Calls on the Council to contribute to ending the current state of uncertainty and absence of any decision by actively supporting the presentation of the latest proposals for a time-limited, phased West Bank withdrawal;

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9. Calls for the immediate implementation of specific measures such as the opening of Gaza airport and 'safe passage' transit arrangements between Gaza and the West Bank for Palestinian workers and food supplies, and draws attention to the undertakings regarding the construction of a seaport in Gaza;
10. Believes that within the framework of the next financial Regulation for aid to the Palestinians, economic support should be maintained at the current level while being aimed at improving the efficiency, transparency and proper functioning of Palestinian institutions;
11. Supports action taken by the Commission to ensure full respect of the EU/Israel Interim Trade Agreement and encourage regional integration by offering cumulation of rules of origin to all Mediterranean countries;
12. Considers that aid from the Union should be granted with a priority to initiatives, in particular those put forward by NGOs, which benefit both communities in the areas of civil society, the strengthening of democratic institutions and the realization of infrastructures promoting economic and social development;
13. Proposes regular joint meetings with parliamentarians from the Knesset and the Palestinian Legislative Council under the aegis of the relevant European Parliament delegation and as appropriate with the participation of parliamentarians from the third countries concerned;
14. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the Israeli Government, the Knesset, the Palestinian Authority, the Palestinian Legislative Council, the Governments and Parliaments of Syria and Lebanon, and the Government and Congress of the United States.

15. Second WTO ministerial conference

B4-0666/98

Resolution on the Second Ministerial Conference of the World Trade Organization (WTO)

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its resolution of 13 November 1996 on the World Trade Organization (WTO) ⁽¹⁾,
 - having regard to its resolutions of 24 May 1996 on the negotiations in the World Trade Organization (WTO) on trade and the environment ⁽²⁾ and 30 April 1998 on environmental, health and consumer protection aspects of world trade ⁽³⁾,
 - having regard to the Commission statement on the Second WTO Ministerial Conference held from 18 to 20 May 1998,
 - having regard to the participation of its delegation in that conference,
- A. whereas, over the 50 years of its existence, the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) made a significant contribution to economic growth and increased prosperity by eliminating barriers to trade,
- B. whereas, however, the industrialized nations and, recently, the newly-industrialized countries have been the chief beneficiaries of this increased prosperity, whilst many developing countries are still suffering from severe poverty,

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- C. whereas the establishment of the WTO in 1995 created an urgently needed institutional framework for the globalization process, a framework which must be further developed and completed in the years to come,
- D. whereas, in view of the differing provisions worldwide in the areas of environmental protection, labour standards and competition rules, there is increasing opposition among the general public to the further liberalization of markets in goods and services,
1. On the 50th anniversary of the establishment of GATT, declares itself satisfied with the progress achieved in the sphere of international trade;
 2. Notes that in the first three years of its existence the WTO has not only established an effective mechanism for settling trade disputes, but has also acted as a forum for continuing negotiations on the opening-up of markets, as demonstrated by the conclusion of the agreements on financial services, information technology and basic telecommunications services;
 3. Notes that WTO rulings, in particular the decision on hormones, have clarified certain legal issues relating to environmental protection;
 4. Regards the fact that 132 states have thus far joined the WTO and more than 30 are currently negotiating the terms of their accession as impressive proof of the need for a worldwide body to draw up and monitor the legal framework for global trade;
 5. Points out, however, that the WTO can call itself a worldwide organization only when states such as the People's Republic of China and the Russian Federation are members on the same terms as all other states;
 6. Endorses the final declaration of the WTO Ministerial Conference, issued on 20 May 1998 in Geneva, and, in that connection, calls for the WTO to hold negotiations on all aspects of electronic trade;
 7. Notes that the agreements negotiated during the Uruguay Round are generally being properly implemented by the WTO member states, but acknowledges, at the same time, the problems faced by many developing countries in honouring their commitments, particularly in the areas of the protection of trade-related intellectual property (TRIPs) and trade-related investment measures (TRIMs);
 8. Calls on the industrialized nations and, in particular, the Commission to provide the developing countries concerned with the technical assistance they need and, if necessary, to examine whether their problems can be solved by adjusting the implementation deadlines;
 9. Calls on the industrialized nations and, in particular, the Commission, when implementing the agreement on the liberalization of trade in textiles and clothing, to pay greater attention to the legitimate interests of the developing countries so as to avoid a situation in which the main thrust of the opening of the market is deferred to the year 2005; insists that the developing countries must for their part honour their trade policy commitments;
 10. Calls on the Commission to prepare carefully the renegotiation of the agreement on agricultural trade scheduled for the year 2000 and to take considerations relating to world trade into account in the reform of the common agricultural policy following the enlargement of the EU to the east;
 11. Draws attention to the responsibility of the EU, as the world's most significant regional economic integration entity, for ensuring that these processes take place in accordance with WTO rules and broaden and strengthen the multilateral trading system;
 12. Calls on the Commission to examine in detail the links which should exist between the multilateral trading system and agreements on regional economic integration, in which context the *acquis communautaire* and the substance of agreements such as the Lomé Convention between the EU and the ACP States must be safeguarded;

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13. Is concerned that the work in the area of trade and the environment has thus far produced no results; welcomes, therefore, the proposal to give this process fresh political impetus by calling in the near future a meeting of senior government representatives;
 14. Calls for the precautionary principle to be explicitly upheld as a priority basis for all decisions which have an impact on public health and consumer protection;
 15. Notes that issues concerning trade and labour standards will continue to be dealt with in the International Labour Organization (ILO), and hopes that at the ILO Ministerial Conference in June 1998 progress will be made in this area which provides the ILO with the instruments it needs to enforce internationally agreed minimum standards;
 16. Regrets the fact that the WTO has not worked together with the ILO on the application of core labour standards, as it was urged to do in the statement issued at the 1996 Singapore Summit;
 17. Regards the opening of a fresh round of negotiations at the beginning of the next millennium as desirable, provided that it covers all areas of interest to the WTO's contracting parties, in particular the link between trade and fundamental problems such as core labour standards, environmental protection and public health, that it is thoroughly prepared and that it receives broad endorsement, in particular from the developing countries, which make up more than 80% of the WTO member states;
 18. Advocates, in this connection, that the negotiations should cover issues relating to the international rules on direct investment and competition policy; advocates, further, the drafting of a code of conduct for international firms regarding compliance with minimum ecological and social standards;
 19. Proposes that the role of the international financial markets and the IMF in the globalization of world trade should be investigated in greater detail and that the EU, its Member States, the WTO and international financial institutions should work together more closely in this sphere;
 20. Calls on the Commission, in future negotiations on trade in services, to insist that the specific cultural identity of the EU Member States should be safeguarded;
 21. Regards greater transparency in the work of the WTO *vis-à-vis* the general public as an urgent requirement and supports the proposal that hearings in connection with dispute settlement procedures should be held in public;
 22. Regrets the fact that the most recent agreements between the EU and the USA with regard to unilateral, extraterritorial American trade sanctions (Helms-Burton Act) run counter to the multilateral nature of the WTO and represent a step backwards in relation to the anticipated outcome of the dispute settlement procedure from which the EU has now unfortunately withdrawn, and takes the view that the Helms-Burton Act should cease to apply to all WTO member states;
 23. Calls on the Commission to submit to Parliament an annual report on EU trade policy which would serve as the basis for a broad public debate on the subject;
 24. Calls, at the same time, for more stringent direct democratic scrutiny of the WTO's work;
 25. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the governments and parliaments of the Member States and the WTO Secretariat.
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16. Situation in Kosovo

Resolution on Kosovo

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its previous resolutions on the situation in Kosovo, in particular its resolution of 14 May 1998 ⁽¹⁾,
 - having regard to the outcome of the meetings of the Council of Ministers of 8/9 June 1998 and the common position adopted on that occasion, the European Council of 15/16 June 1998, the Contact Group for the former Yugoslavia of 12 June 1998 and the North Atlantic Council In Defence Ministers Session of 11/12 June 1998,
- A. expressing its most profound concern about the continuing and increasing violations of basic human rights, the process of ethnic cleansing and the extremely violent aggression carried out by the Serbian special police, Yugoslav army units and paramilitary forces against the population of Kosovo,
- B. noting with abhorrence that the indiscriminate attacks by the special police, Yugoslav army units and paramilitary forces against the population of Kosovo, carried out with the assistance of heavy weaponry, have resulted in the deaths of many hundreds of civilians and have caused many thousands of people to seek refuge in neighbouring countries and regions, and that the stream of refugees is still growing,
- C. stressing once again that the use of violence to suppress political dissent as well as the use of terrorist actions to achieve political change should be categorically rejected as a means of bringing about a solution to the crisis in Kosovo,
- D. whereas all the diplomatic efforts so far made and the economic pressure, including sanctions, so far brought to bear by the Council and the Contact Group have proved to be ineffective,
- E. emphasizing once again that these actions by the Belgrade regime constitute a most serious threat to peace, security and stability in the whole of the region, especially to the neighbouring countries and regions,
- F. emphasizing that all necessary measures should be taken into consideration to stop this process of ethnic cleansing, brutal aggression and destabilization by the Belgrade regime and that the European Union and its Member States should take an active part in these actions,
- G. having regard to the stiffer sanctions the USA and the European Union at last intend to impose on Belgrade and the recent manoeuvres carried out by NATO, which are a sign of its readiness to intervene militarily,
- H. whereas ways should be found to avoid imposing harsh measures on the Republic of Montenegro, whose government and parliament are trying to play a responsible role in this crisis,
- I. noting that the continuing and increasing aggression by the Belgrade regime against the population of Kosovo is making it more and more difficult to find a political solution through dialogue to the conflict in Kosovo,
- J. emphasizing once again that a full and meaningful dialogue on the future status of Kosovo, aiming at a special status with a large degree of autonomy within the framework of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, between the Belgrade regime and the representatives of the population of Kosovo, accompanied by a complete end to the actions of aggression against the population of Kosovo and withdrawal of the Serbian special police, Yugoslav army units and paramilitary forces, is the only acceptable way to solve the crisis in Kosovo,

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1. Strongly condemns the continuing and ever increasing violations of basic human rights, the process of ethnic cleansing and the extremely violent aggression carried out by the Serbian special police, Yugoslav army units and paramilitary forces against the population of Kosovo, and continues to condemn the use of violence by all parties;
 2. Calls on the Belgrade regime to put an immediate end to the indiscriminate attacks by the special police, Yugoslav army units and paramilitary forces against the people of Kosovo and considers it the duty of the international community to make every effort to stop these attacks and to protect the Kosovo civilian population from these ethnic cleansing operations;
 3. Insists that talks between Belgrade and the representatives of the Kosovo Albanians be resumed forthwith, in a neutral location and with international mediation;
 4. Welcomes the common position taken by the Council, including a ban on new investments in Serbia and the freezing of funds of the FRY, as a further step to put pressure on the Serbian authorities, but calls at the same time on the Council and the Member States to take all further measures that are considered necessary to stop this process of ethnic cleansing, aggression and destabilization by the Belgrade regime and to promote actively a decision by the UN Security Council permitting the possible use of military force which may be deemed necessary to achieve this goal; therefore supports the preparations for possible military intervention on the basis of the NATO/WEU framework, both to protect the people of Kosovo and to prevent this conflict from spreading to neighbouring states;
 5. Calls on the Commission, the Council and the Member States to give their fullest possible support to the neighbouring countries and regions, including support, where necessary within the framework of the WEU and NATO, to guarantee their security and stability in the region;
 6. Calls on the United Nations to send international observers without delay to cover the length of the frontiers between Kosovo and Serbia;
 7. Calls on the Commission and the Council to send as quickly as possible a humanitarian mission with the task of organizing the distribution of aid to the Kosovan refugees and to examine the possibility of creating humanitarian corridors along which international aid could be safely and quickly transported;
 8. Calls on the Commission and the Council to give all necessary humanitarian aid to the victims of, and the refugees from, the acts of violence in Kosovo and calls on Member States to stop sending refugees and asylum-seekers back to Kosovo where protection cannot be guaranteed;
 9. Points out that the powers of the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia (ICTFY) extend to the whole of the former Yugoslavia and calls in consequence on its Prosecutor-General to take all measures in his power to ensure that those responsible for the crimes committed in Kosovo are prosecuted;
 10. Gives its full support to all persons and organizations within and outside Kosovo who are still attempting to resolve the conflict in Kosovo by seeking a political solution through dialogue;
 11. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council, the WEU, NATO, the UN Security Council, the Presidents and the Governments of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia and of Serbia and the representatives of the population in Kosovo.
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17. Fiscal policy

A4-0228/98

Resolution on the Commission communication 'A package to tackle harmful tax competition in the European Union' (COM(97)0564 — C4-0333/98)

The European Parliament,

- having regard to a the Commission communication (COM(97)0564 — C4-0333/98),
 - having regard to the report of the Committee on Economic and Monetary Affairs and Industrial Policy (A4-0228/98),
- A. whereas a broad issue to tackle is the evolution of the European structure of economic governance as far as non-monetary matters are concerned, with a particular focus on taxation,
- B. whereas the drive towards enhanced policy coordination, as recalled in the Council's conclusions under the Luxembourg presidency, is a crucial tool for avoiding any further obstacles in the completion and the correct functioning of the single market, especially in the field of taxation; whereas the coordination of taxation will also represent a vital instrument in fulfilling employment policy guidelines by relieving the burden of taxation on labour,
- C. whereas a certain degree of competition among national systems will be engendered as a result of the greater transparency achieved by the introduction of the single currency, which will, in turn, stimulate efficiency and increase consumer welfare,
- D. whereas it is clear that this competition must not go beyond a beneficial level and be excessive, in the sense that it should not be harmful, i.e. cause more costs than benefits,
- E. whereas the lack of coordination among national tax systems and the consequent high degree of tax competition among Member States has reached a level which is proving to be harmful, resulting in a potential failure to harvest the full benefits which the single market can provide in terms of growth and employment, given the increased tax burden put on labour compared with the more mobile capital,
- F. whereas the lack of fiscal harmonisation and the excessive levels of competition have caused a progressive loss of sovereignty by Member States over taxation policy and hence over their fiscal instrument, as a consequence of potential tax erosion and loss of fiscal revenues produced by unchecked tax competition,
- G. whereas there is a clear need of coordination of the evolution of national tax systems and a certain degree of fiscal harmonisation, particularly in those areas where harmful tax competition could produce adverse effects (indirect taxes, business taxation, taxation of mobile factors such as capital, tax treatment of non-resident citizens and companies, energy and environmental taxes, tax treatment of cross-border labour),
- H. whereas this need is particularly strong given the distorting effects of widely differing rates of excise duties,
- I. whereas differences in taxation systems and levels which are based on social motives or criteria concerning the environment, public health and protection of consumers are not to be seen as harmful tax competition,
- J. whereas decisions on minimum levels of taxation and common economic means of control to protect the environment and public health can be made at EU level,
- K. whereas it is necessary to accept a 'beneficial' level of tax competition in order to foster an improvement in the level of competitiveness,

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- L. whereas it is clear that the problem of tax havens within the territory of Member States of the EU is a question which must be given primary importance in any attempt to fight harmful tax competition,
- M. whereas other areas of intervention requiring a degree of coordination and harmonisation, such as State aids, should be identified,

General remarks

1. Welcomes the speeding up of the process aimed at tackling the issue of tax coordination in the European Union and the commitment of the Council in this respect, being fully convinced of the fact that the current distortions in taxation systems might increasingly result in a failure to harvest the full benefits which the single market can provide in terms of growth and employment, as well as in a progressive loss of sovereignty by Member States over taxation policy and hence over their fiscal instrument, as a consequence of the tax erosion which has resulted from harmful tax competition;
2. Given the complexity of the task, and the numerous inter-linked interests of EU companies and citizens, endorses the Commission's approach aimed at the constitution of a 'package' of proposals, in the shared belief that a better prospect of agreement and a more pervasive defence of the various interests at stake will more easily be achieved than if each policy issue is tackled separately;
3. Agrees with the idea that such a package should be composed of (a) a Code of Conduct for business taxation, (b) a European solution in the area of taxation of income from savings and (c) measures to eliminate withholding taxes on cross-border interest and royalty payments between companies;
4. Considers, however, that the synchronism in the legislative progress of the various elements of the package should be taken as a broad target to be achieved in the medium term, and not be used, on the contrary, as a tool by Member States to delay approval of the various elements of the package;
5. Regarding European Parliament and Council Decision 888/98/EC of 30 March 1998 establishing an action programme to improve indirect taxation systems in the single market (Fiscalis programme) ⁽¹⁾ regrets to note that this programme has been unbundled by the original Commission's proposal; welcomes however the agreement reached with the Council which is allowing the programme to be fully implemented already for 1998;

A Code of Conduct for business taxation and related issues

6. Welcomes the adoption by the Council of a Resolution of the Council and the representatives of the Governments of the Member States meeting within the Council of 1 December 1997 on a code of conduct for business taxation ⁽²⁾ and the establishment of a Code of Conduct Group, in order to assess the tax measures that may fall within the scope of the code and to oversee the provision of information on those measures; welcomes also the important role of the Commission in supporting the work of the Group and expects to be kept well informed on the progress made;
7. Acknowledges the fact that, although no specific mention of its role has been expressly made in the Commission's communication, some of the specific measures suggested in its resolution of 29 May 1997 on the Commission report on taxation in the European Union: report on the development of tax systems ⁽³⁾ have been taken on board by the Commission and the Council;
8. Recognizes in particular that its request for a precise definition of the spheres of taxation to which the code of conduct applies, the stand-still and roll-back clauses, the commitment of Member States to inform each other of existing and proposed tax measures which fall within the scope of the Code, in accordance to the general principles of transparency and openness, have all been included in the Commission's document approved by the Ecofin Council;
9. Stresses the need for the Code of Conduct to be faithfully respected;

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10. Regrets to note, however, that some other proposals of similar importance contained in its resolution, namely the general issue of the measures designed to eliminate significant distortions in the area of indirect taxation while creating at the same time alternative sources of revenue, such as environmental and energy taxes, although originally included in the Commission communication of 1 October 1997 'Towards coordination of taxation in the European Union' (COM(97)0495), have not subsequently been put forward;

11. While recognising that the adopted Code of Conduct relates only to direct business taxation, regrets that its proposals on the elimination of all forms of double taxation on income from labour and of other obstacles resulting from taxation or social charges which restrict mobility within the Union have not so far been taken into account by the Commission and the Council;

12. Also considers that there should finally be uniform definitions of such tax concepts as basis of assessment, earnings and the rules on writing-off;

13. Calls for the speeding up of the elimination of tax havens in the EU internal market in order to put an end to the ruinous tax competition between the Member States which is not consistent with the single market or with the spirit of the Community;

A European solution in the area of taxation of income from savings

14. Supports the Commission proposal and the agreement reached in the Ecofin Council for a minimum Community solution in the area of the taxation of income from savings paid in one Member State to individuals who are not resident for tax purposes in that State, in order to counter current and potential distortions of the single market and to prevent significant losses of tax revenues as a result of the non-taxation of non-residents;

15. Looks forward to a commonly agreed solution in the area of the taxation of savings and welcomes the Commission's undertaking to come up shortly with a proposal in this field; points out in this context that the competitiveness of the European financial markets must be maintained at international level;

Measures to eliminate withholding taxes on cross-border interest and royalty payments between companies

16. Welcomes the Commission's proposal for a Council Directive on a Community system of taxation applicable to interest and royalty payments made between associated companies of different Member States (COM(98)0067) ⁽¹⁾ as being in line with its requests for measures which might offset the double taxation of certain cross-border activities;

17. Looks forward to expressing its comments on the document in line with the provisions of the legal basis of the proposal;

Conclusions

18. Considers the package of measures presented by the Commission as the minimum set of rules it is necessary to adopt in order to counter the previously analysed consequences of harmful tax competition and in order to fight unemployment successfully;

19. Welcomes beneficial tax competition among Member States as a tool to increase the competitiveness of the European economy confronted with the challenges of globalization;

20. Considers it necessary to reach a common minimal basis in all fields where tax competition degenerates into harmful behaviour by reaching an equitable compromise between subsidiarity and enhanced economic policy coordination;

21. Calls upon the Commission to put forward proposals which could strengthen and complete the existing package, including in the field of indirect taxation, to monitor more closely the issue of fiscal state aids in the Member States and to involve Parliament formally and more closely in the appropriate fora of discussion for the implementation of its strategy on taxation policy;

18. Transport of nuclear waste

B4-0612, 0633, 0678, 0680, 0682 and 0684/98

Resolution on the safety of transport of nuclear fuel and waste

The European Parliament,

- A. whereas nuclear waste is transported over long distances to storage and reprocessing plants throughout Europe,
- B. whereas reprocessing of spent fuel rods and production of MOX fuel elements are increasing,
- C. having regard to the latest scientific findings regarding the safety of radioactive waste transport containers ('Castor flasks') and the possibility of radiation escaping,
- D. whereas the German and French energy supply companies, as originators of consignments, are responsible for this unacceptable situation,
- E. whereas the need for safety has absolute priority over profitability and the guarantee of supplies,
- F. whereas in paragraph 2 of Parliament's resolution of 27 March 1996 on radioactive waste ⁽¹⁾, the Commission had already been asked 'to assess the economic viability and risks in terms of public safety and impact on the environment of the carriage of nuclear materials in the European Union',

1. Welcomes the decision by France and Germany to suspend all transport of nuclear waste and condemns strongly the attitude of the companies involved which have withheld information on cases of contamination;
2. Calls on the French and German governments to investigate thoroughly the cases of contamination caused by the transport of spent fuel rods, to inform the public and to eliminate any abuses identified;
3. Condemns the actions of the energy supply undertakings involved, the specialized firm contracted to organize the transport and the firm responsible for the reprocessing, which knew for years that the consignments contravened the rules governing the transport of radioactive materials;
4. Calls once again on the Commission to assess the economic viability and risks in terms of public safety and impact on the environment of the carriage of nuclear materials in the European Union;
5. Calls on the Commission to assess the economic viability of the use of MOX in a long-term European perspective and, if appropriate, devise strategies for dispensing with reprocessing of spent fuel rods;
6. Condemns the lack of serious control during the last ten years; notes that it is only now that many cases of contamination are being reported in rail and road transport of spent fuel rods from nuclear power stations;
7. Calls on the Commission to propose uniform standards for evaluating safety when transporting nuclear materials and an inspection system for this, so as to ensure uniform operation throughout the European Union, and to render the evaluation findings transparent;
8. Calls on the Commission to amend Directive 92/3/Euratom of 3 February 1992 on the supervision and control of shipments of radioactive waste between Member States and into and out of the Community ⁽²⁾ so as to make it incumbent upon nuclear power plant and waste shipment operators to notify contamination levels in excess of limit values;

9. Calls on the relevant Member States not to resume the transport of spent fuel rods until the safety authorities have guaranteed that the firms in question have put in place appropriate procedures to prevent such situations from occurring again and that systems for informing the relevant authorities have been set up and can be monitored at any time;
 10. Asks the Member States that radioactivity checks be carried out by bodies totally independent from those producing the radioactivity in order to ensure that the data is completely reliable;
 11. Calls on the Commission to reveal the risks associated with the transport of radioactive waste and to take the public's scepticism seriously rather than, as in point 7.2 of the 'proposed programme of action on the transport of radioactive material' in communication COM(98)0155, assigning priority to 'informing the public and the media on the various safety aspects of international transport operations in order to improve the public perception of such transport';
 12. Asks the Commission to give its current assessment of the feasibility of applying the proximity rule in drawing up decisions on reprocessing and final disposal, in accordance with the request made by Parliament in its abovementioned resolution of 27 March 1996, which would limit transportation risks; calls on the Member States concerned to adhere in all cases of transport of nuclear material to the principle of the shortest possible transportation distance and whenever possible to avoid densely populated areas;
 13. Calls again on the Commission to submit without delay proposals for dealing with radioactive waste, particularly strategies to solve the problem of final storage of such waste;
 14. Calls on the Commission to act as rapidly as possible to meet its own responsibilities in this connection by conducting the necessary investigations, and to inform Parliament of the results;
 15. Calls moreover on the Commission to investigate the extent to which Member States have infringed European radiation protection rules, and to initiate any appropriate legal action;
 16. Calls once again for greater openness in reporting and for transparency in nuclear shipments, which is the most important element for public acceptance;
 17. Calls on the Commission to make available to Parliament the minutes of the Standing Working Group on the Safe Transport of Radioactive Material;
 18. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission and the governments of the Member States.
